# Student devices at XP

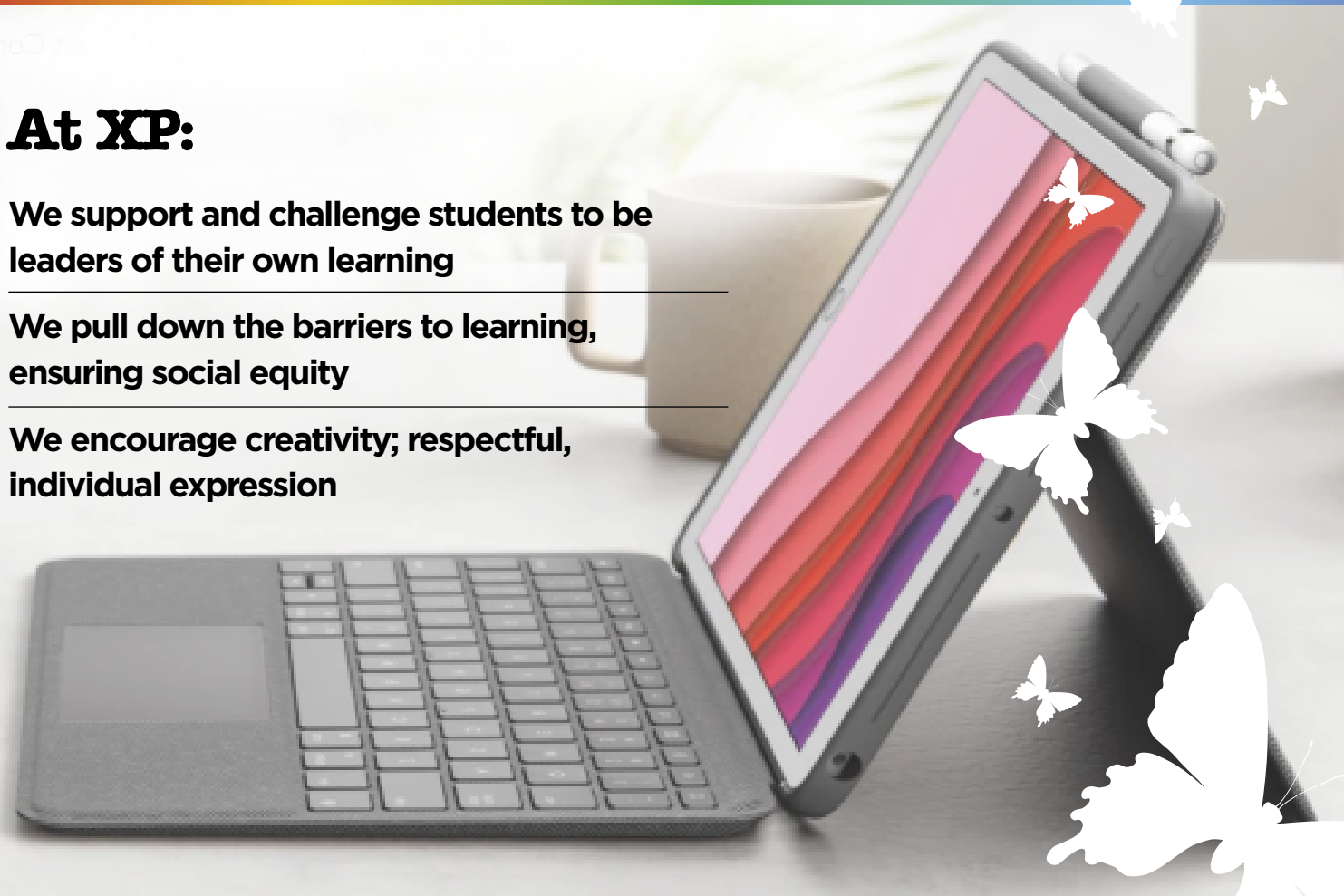
## Parent's guide

### At XP:

**We support and challenge students to be leaders of their own learning**

**We pull down the barriers to learning, ensuring social equity**

**As we all know, technology continues to improve, and we are now highly recommending that parents purchase the latest iPads, which gives them access to Google Docs and many creative apps such as iMovie, GarageBand and art apps. We believe that iPads are now the best pound-for-pound device for learning.**

To enable this to happen for our students, we have created a great value parental contribution scheme which offers all our parents affordable access to the latest iPad with comprehensive insurance. In our scheme, you are able to buy an iPad with a keyboard case and trackpad, with the option to purchase an Apple Pencil.

Pricing is different for different year groups, reflecting the length of the payment plan and insurance cover for the time our students are at our schools.

The iPads come with comprehensive insurance with accidental damage covered and no excess (screens must be fitted with a screen protector). If a screen is damaged without a protector applied an excess of £50 will be charged to the family. If a device is lost or stolen, it cannot be used, repurposed or reformatted by anyone else.

The Apple Pencil is designed for artists who need pressure sensitivity and tilt. If you want to buy a cheaper pencil, the Logitech Crayon supports tilt but not pressure sensitivity for about £60. You can find an even cheaper option with 'palm-rejection' from Amazon for about £25 which allows you to rest your hand on the iPad while writing. Cheaper ones without palm rejection just act like your finger, but with more accuracy.

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This cost to parents is significantly cheaper than if you were to buy them from a shop (roughly 20% cheaper), and you get to spread the cost over the payment plan. After the final payment, the iPad is yours to do with as you wish.

The scheme allows the school to manage the iPads, which means that during school time, only apps needed for school will be available. This helps us keep our students safe and distraction free whilst using devices. Out of school, any other apps can be installed by students but they will not be available from 8am to 4pm on school days. During the evenings, weekends and holidays, you can use your iPad freely.

### Expectations of every student

**At secondary schools**, all students must bring their own appropriate device to learn at XP.

**At primary schools in Years 3-6**, we are launching our iPad parent contribution scheme to enable your child to access the best technology in their classroom.

**In school years below this**, iPads will be made available to your children.
