





The Frenchgate Centre






CHSWOPEH HEEF






Carepsall Chierch


James Paine designed the Mansion House. He was an English architect. He also designed Chatsworth House and Thorndon Hall. He was born in 1717 and died in 1779.

There are only three mansion houses in England. One is in Doncaster, the second is in York and the third is in London.









Doncaster Stage's Therster






Doncaster Rogal Infermaty







Eco Power Stadien









Doncaster Racecourse



















Doncaster Done

The Yorkshie Catevan



The Yorkshire Gateway is 8.6m tall - which is as high as two double decker buses!








Danier Callery, Library & Mescella









Stie Chief Kalgialian Chiamana

A mosque is an Islamic place of worship for Muslims. The word mosque comes from the Arabic word 'masjid'.


Muslims worship Allah – they study a holy book called the Quran and hold special services on a Friday.


Mosques are found all over the world. The biggest mosque is in Mecca, Saudi Arabia. It is called Masjid al-Haram.


In Doncaster we actually have two mosques. One is called Doncaster Jamia Masjid and the other is Doncaster Jamia Masjid Sultania.

Everybody must remove their shoes before entering a mosque.








Corisbrough Castle
