Reading at Heartlands

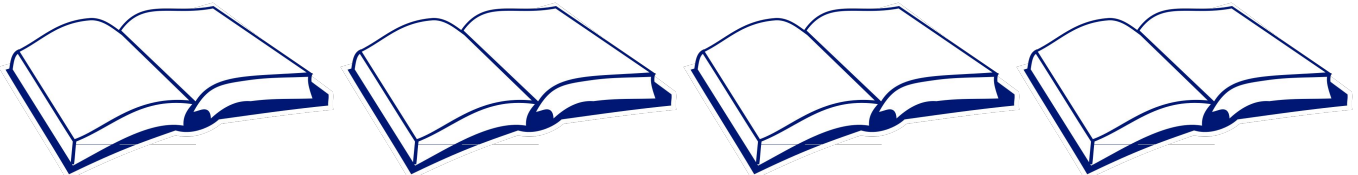
 All Heartlands students must read for at least 20 minutes every day.

 This could be a chapter book, a comic book, magazines or an audiobook.

 Good times to read include before bed, while waiting for dinner or on bus journeys.

 Every student gets a chance to take two books a week from the school library for free.

To prepare for secondary school, all Year 6s try to read **four books** over the summer. When you start at Heartlands, there will be a chance to celebrate your summer reading and even earn some merits!



For some of you, this will be easy as you already love reading. For others, you might not have enjoyed reading much in Primary School, and might be nervous about reading more at Secondary School. No matter how confident you feel, we will help you find books.



And he wore a badge, a big one. It covered about half his chest. Which wasn't that hard since his chest was so scrawny.

<p>Apprentice League</p> <p>(2 merits per challenge)</p> 	<p>Read three chapters of a book</p> <p><i>Try getting stuck into a book, including a short book, a comic book, or an audiobook. Use your 'To Read' list to find suggestions. Even if you don't finish, you tried something new!</i></p>	<p>Give or get a book recommendation</p> <p><i>Ask someone for a book recommendation or tell someone a book you like. You can ask adults what they read at your age, or ask for tips at the library.</i></p>	<p>Listen to a poem</p> <p><i>Try reading a poem. There are lots of different kinds - silly, serious, romantic, adventurous! Try listening to one on the website www.childrens.poetryarchive.org</i></p>	<p>Try reading aloud</p> <p><i>Try reading aloud. You and a friend could take turns reading something aloud together, or you could read to a younger family member - even a pet!</i></p>

On fire: I love reading, and I want a challenge!

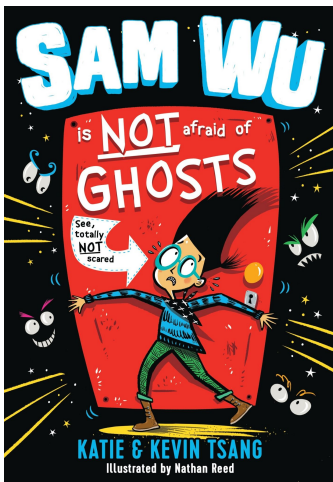
Medium: I feel okay about reading, and I like reading sometimes

Feeling mild: I don't like reading much, or I find it difficult



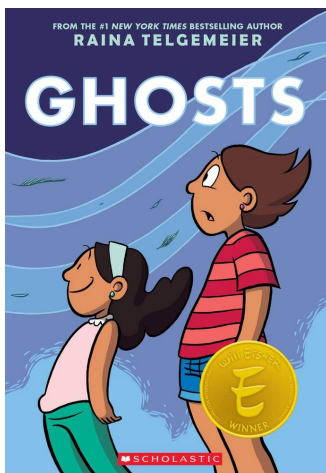
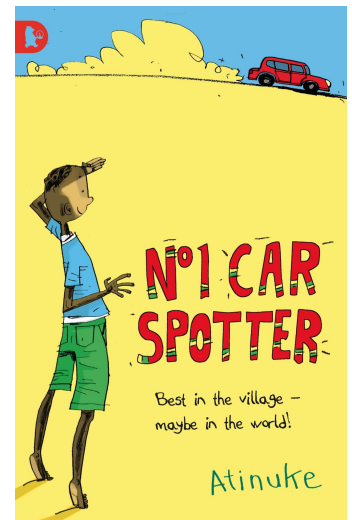
Try looking at the reading list that matches your feelings. If you spot something you like on a different list, don't be afraid to try that too. Write down books you want to try on your 'To Read' list.

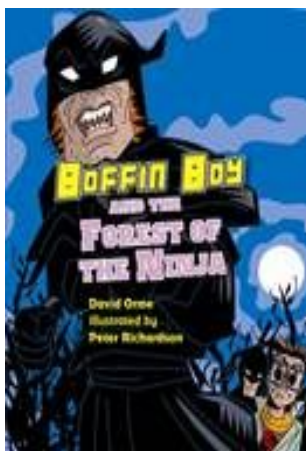
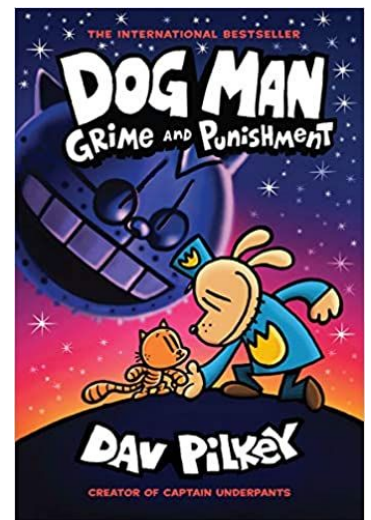
Sam Wu doesn't want anyone to know how many things he's scared of! But then, a school trip goes wrong...

Car spotting is the only hobby in Oluwalase's small African village. He is No. 1 at it – probably the best in the world! But can he prove it?



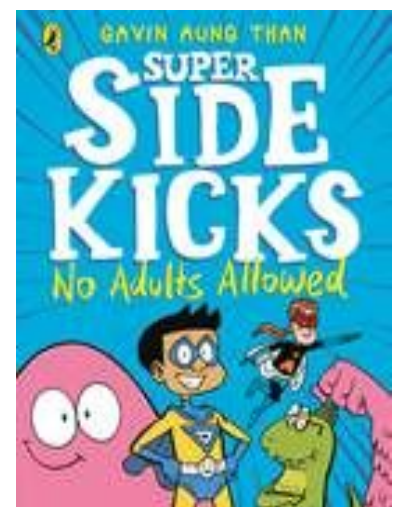

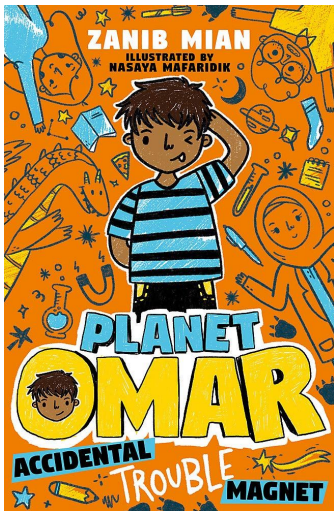

JJ and his friends Fly Girl and Dinomite are sick of being taken for granted by the adult superheroes they work for. It's time to prove that they're not just sidekicks!

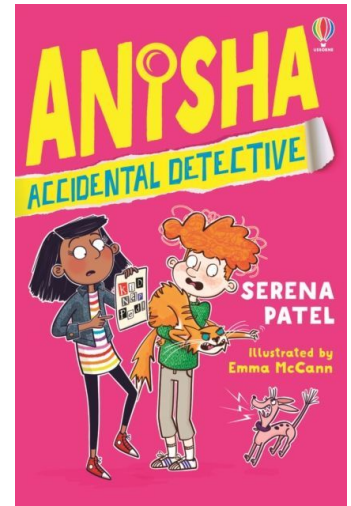

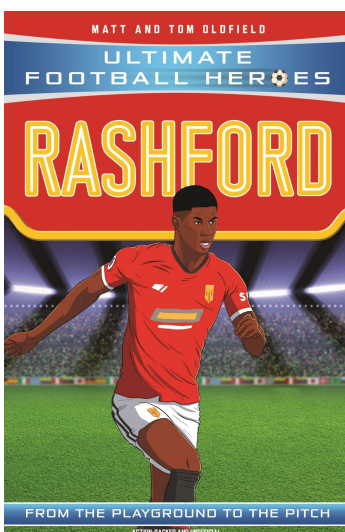
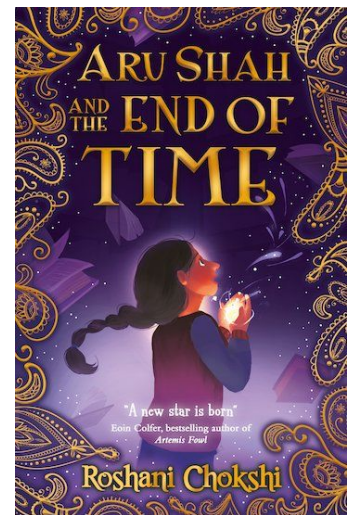
Omar has just moved into a new house with his family: school trouble, silly moments and lots of doodles!

Anisha's Aunt Bindi is getting married tomorrow and the groom has been kidnapped! Can Anisha track down the culprit in time for his wedding?



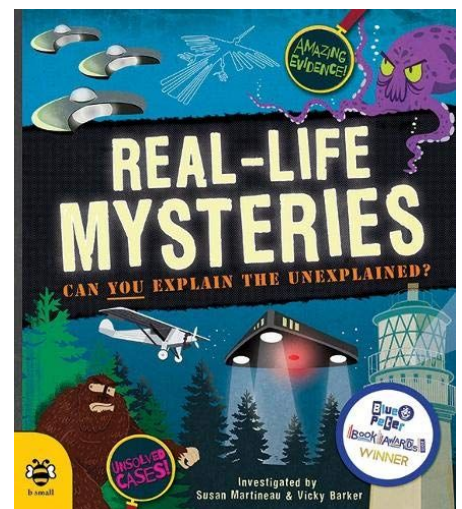
For fans of scary books: one day Coraline unlocks a mysterious door that opens onto another world, where she discovers something very sinister about her 'other mother'

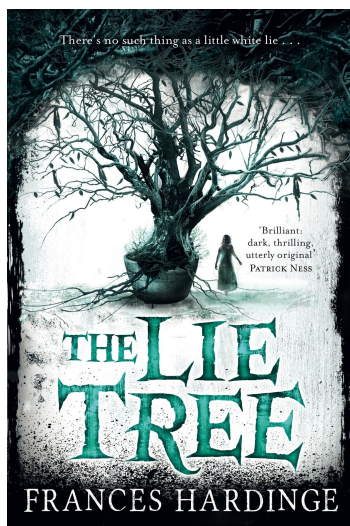


Read the story of Manchester United superstar Marcus Rashford, from tough beginnings to goalscoring legend!

With mysteries Loch Ness Monster and friends, read the amazing evidence about these mysterious cases and make up your own mind.

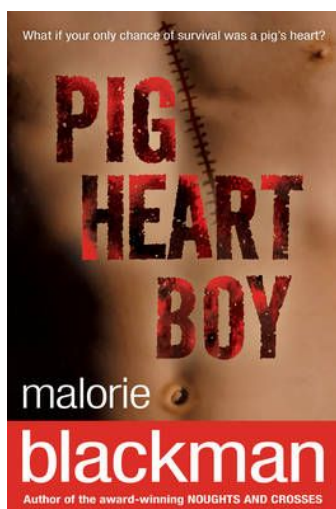
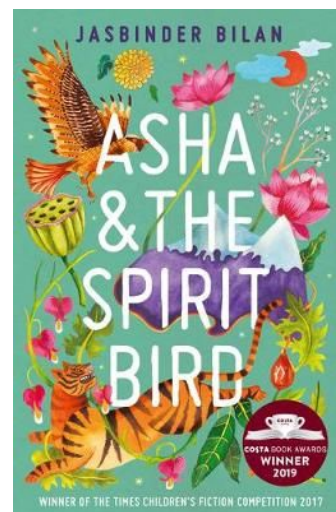

This book covers a big range of science topics from the big bang theory, what the earth is made of, planets in our solar system and the building blocks of life.

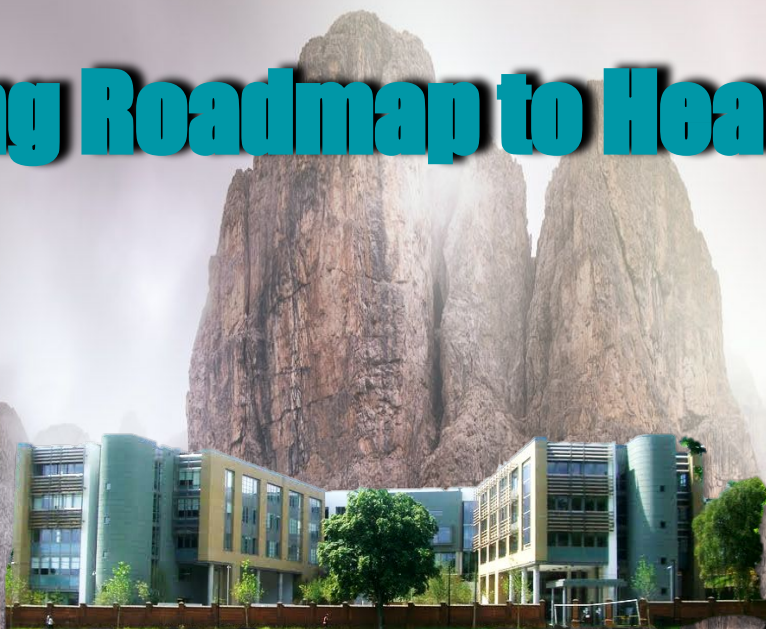
The Discworld is very much like our own - if our own were to consist of a flat planet balanced on the back of four elephants which stand on the back of a giant turtle, that is . . .

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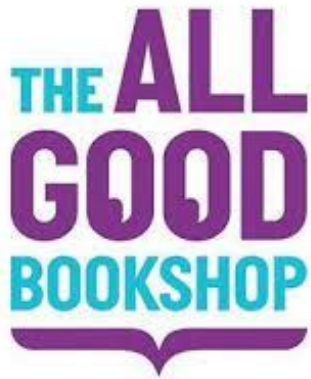
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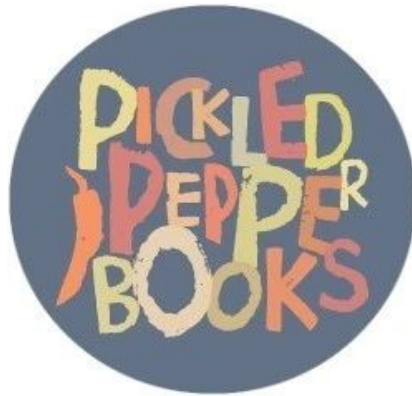

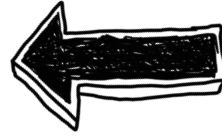
