
EAL Reward Trip to Matilda

Preparing for University



We're thrilled to share that our final SEARCH Day of the year will take place on Tuesday 8th July, and it promises to be our biggest and most enriching one yet! We've significantly increased the number of trips, giving our students the chance to explore an even wider range of exciting destinations across London and beyond. These include: the Golden Hinde, Kew Gardens, the Huguenot Museum, the Velodrome, the National Maritime Museum, Borough Market, the Science Museum, the Dickens Museum, the Museum of Brands, the French Institute, the Imperial War Museum, the Gurdwara Singh Sabha London East, and the London Central Mosque.

These visits are designed to spark curiosity, deepen learning, and broaden horizons—core aims of our SEARCH programme. We're also expanding our in-school enrichment opportunities. Recent highlights include a powerful live performance of *Macbeth* by a visiting theatre company for our Year 11s, and an inspiring careers fair featuring over 20 colleges and sixth forms, helping students plan their next steps. We're proud of how SEARCH Days continue to grow and offer students meaningful, memorable experiences that go beyond the classroom.
