Just as we practice fire drills to prepare for the unexpected, we will be conducting a **live lockdown practice** in the afternoon of **February 24th**.

- **What happens?** A tannoy announcement will signal the start. Students and staff will remain in classrooms and sit quietly until a second announcement signals the end of the drill.
- **Minimising Anxiety:** We are not looking to startle anyone. Staff will speak with students beforehand to explain the "why" behind the exercise, ensuring they feel informed and empowered rather than anxious.
- **The Goal:** Calm, fast, and instinctive responses. We want safety procedures to be second nature for every member of our community.


Year 10 & 11 Community Languages
