On Monday 3rd July, we had a Safeguarding Review led by a serving head teacher of another secondary school. We are pleased to announce that we are a 'safe' school. The following were identified as strengths:

- "The school clearly places SG at heart of everything they do as evidenced by such a large and distinct team who take their responsibilities very seriously
- The team is "extremely confident and passionate... and has put in place "highly effective systems"
- Governance would appears to be "very strong and effective indicating continued outstanding leadership and management."

Sadly, once again we joined the rest of the UK to pay homage to those who died or were injured as a result of the tragic fire in Grenfell Tower. Staff and students participated in the 'Green for Grenfell' appeal and observed a minute's silence. Money collected will be passed on to support victims of the tragedy.

In this newsletter, we focus on growing concerns with children self-harming, summer safety and a review of some of our successful safeguarding practices.

Self-harm

What have we done this year?

Here is a summary of all the activities linked to safeguarding that we have been involved in this academic year:

MHFA trained staff: We are pleased to announce that we now have two qualified Mental Health First Aid staff, Ms Woolford our Pastoral Manager for Year 9 and Ms Hussain a teacher in the Maths department.

Successful Fire Drills: staff and students demonstrated how to keep themselves safe in the event of a fire evacuation. All procedures went smoothly and staff and students were able to be out of the new building as quickly as 2 minutes.

Your Life You Choose – the project delivered a one day multi-agency presentation to educate young people about the consequences of crime, not only for the offender but their family and friends, victims and the wider community. The project is led by magistrates in the North West London Justice Area.

Mindfulness – students have been introduced to mindfulness as part of PE lessons, staff have participated in a 9-week Mindfulness programme to encourage well-being.

Anti-Bullying Conference – our student voice leads have participated in the Brent Anti-Bullying Conference Safeguarding surveys: staff and students have completed a variety of surveys to raise awareness of different issues affecting young people including bullying and gender differences. A number of actions will follow such as further training for staff and raising awareness of how to protect yourself from bullying.

PSHEE – our PSHEE programme has continued to be an informative and valuable part of the curriculum which reinforces Alperton's '4Rs'; being Ready, Respectuful, Responsible and Resilient
