### MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Well done to our Year 11 and Year 13 students who worked very hard on revision during the Easter break. We had a very full programme of activities throughout the two week break with excellent attendance from our students who are about to embark on their examinations this summer.

Please note that the written GCSE examinations will begin on Monday 13 May, but the vast majority of the year group will be in lessons (or examinations) until the Whitsun half term. Study leave ahead of half term is only granted in exceptional circumstances. Year 13 students will also be in normal lessons until half term. As we begin the summer term we also expect that Year 12 students will very shortly begin their A2 units of

We anticipate that the removal of AS examinations from the Year 12 timeline will mean that students should have moved well beyond the AS curriculum by the end of this academic year.




### **Exeter University students visit Alperton**
