Topics you will study include: Research methods, and a choice of one of the following topics: Culture and Identity; Families and Households; Health; Work, Poverty and Welfare.

These are the Units of Work / Modules we study in Year 2

Unit 1 - Education with Theory and Methods: Alongside the revision of Year 1 topics, topics you will study: Theory and Methods, this includes consensus, conflict, structural and social action theories, the concepts of modernity and post-modernity in relation to sociological theory, positivism and interpretivism.

Unit 2 - Topics in Sociology: Alongside revision of Year 1 topics, you will study one of the following: Beliefs in Society; Global Development; The Media; and Stratification and Differentiation.

Unit 3 - Crime and Deviance with Theory and Methods: Topics you will study include: Research Methods and Crime and Deviance, including social order and control, distribution of crime by social groups; prevention, punishment and the role of the criminal justice system; globalisation and crime in contemporary society; the media and crime; green crime; human rights and state crimes.
