I am sure that many parents will have noticed that the DfE School Performance Tables for 2019 have been updated and published. Once again, our results were "above average" for GCSEs with a P8 score of +0.28. Our academic A Level results were overall in line with national progress, while our Applied/Vocational results were "well above average" and almost one whole grade above expected (+0.9). At A Level we were in the top 3 schools for the highest percentage of students with the top grades of AAB or better. Well done to our students and thank you to all the teachers and support staff who contributed to these results. Please remember how important attendance is. Our student attendance for the most recent year (2018-2019) was 0.6% above national averages – this is well above national standards.

Thank you to all the parents who supported our Year 10 Parents Event last Thursday. The parent turnout was 95%. A special well done to 10T who achieved a 100% turnout – congratulations Mr Rivard and Ms Rajpara!!

Finally, our Pre-Public Examinations (PPEs) for Year 11 begin in the week after half term. If you are a parent of a Year 11 student, please remind them of the importance of this week – they should revise for at least six hours every day. Also, for parents of students in other year groups, please make sure you check Show My Homework as all the students have plenty of home study for the half term break.
