Message from the Headteacher

Welcome to our first Parents Newsletter of the Summer Term. I do hope that you and your families are healthy and safe. I can certainly appreciate the challenges of keeping children at home during lockdown, so thank you for all the work you are putting in to support your children's education.

All our lessons take place on Google Classrooms and all the lessons follow your child's normal timetable. Teachers are available throughout the online lesson and they will either communicate directly with the whole class or are able to help individual students with their work.

I am sure you are aware that there is a Bank Holiday on Friday 8th May as the nation celebrates the 75th anniversary of VE (Victory in Europe) Day. This means there will not be any lessons on Friday.

We have been putting together our first ever reports to parents about online work. Your child has been graded by their teachers on the completion of online work done at home and the quality of online work done at home. We hope to send these reports to the parents of Year 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 students later this week. These reports are particularly important for Year 10 and Year 12 students who will be sitting public examinations in 2021. As far as we are aware, the Government does not have any plans to change the 2021 examinations, which means the GCSE and A Level work being covered in class now will be examined next summer.

We are also aware of the impact COVID-19 is having on Ramadan. The Muslim Council of Britain, the largest umbrella organisation for Muslims in Britain, has published online guidance to help millions cope with the restrictions of lockdown during the coming fasting month of Ramadan. As always, we expect all our students to participate fully in every lesson.

Finally, a reminder that the school is open to specific children. If your work is critical to the COVID-19 response, or you work in one of the critical sectors, and you cannot keep your child safe at home then your children will be prioritised for education provision at the school. Please keep safe and stay healthy.
