#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

I am pleased to inform you about the arrangements for our school reopening in September 2020. On 2nd July, the Department for Education published guidance for the full reopening of schools in September 2020. The guidance explains that all children should return to school and attendance will be compulsory. Students are required to return on the following dates wearing full school uniform:

Thursday 3rd September: Year 7 and Year 12 Induction Friday 4th September: Year 7 and Year 12 Induction Monday 7th September: All students return to school

On Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th September we will stagger the start of the school day so that students do not arrive at the same time. Full details about the start times will be sent later this week. Over the course of these days we will ensure that students are clear about the changes we have made to our school procedures. This is because the Department for Education guidance explains that schools must minimise the number of contacts a child has during the school day. For example, every year group will have a separate playground/social area, each floor has a one-way system and key stage 3 students will be located in a Form Base Room for many of their lessons.

From Wednesday 9th September, all students will arrive at the normal start time of 8:30am. We will maintain the same school day with five one hour lessons, however, we will slightly shorten lunch time so that different year groups will leave school at different times at the end of the day. Please note, the teaching time for every year group will remain the same –students will not lose learning time. Students will also receive a full broad and balanced curriculum – practical subjects such as Drama, Music and Art will continue to be taught in the autumn term.

Also, from September, we have changed the location of some year groups. The new locations will be:

#### EALING ROAD: Years 7, 8 and 9 STANLEY AVENUE: Years 10 and 11

The Sixth Form will be taught on both sites, with Year 12 mostly taught at Ealing Road and Year 13 at Stanley Avenue.

We are currently producing a parent and student guide to the school procedures in September. We hope to send this out to you later this week. In the meantime, I would like to thank you for all your support with home learning over the past few months as we look forward to a return to school for all students in September. Please check our website regularly for the most up to date information.

## Amazing Results in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge 2020

The Junior Maths Challenge is run by the UK Mathematics Trust and every year Alperton students in years 7 and 8 are selected to participate in this challenge. Usually, students would have found themselves completing a multiple choice set of questions on paper, but for this year they were asked to sit the challenge online for the very first time. In total, 58 of our students successfully participated in the challenge, and 29 of them received fantastic results!

Overall, they achieved 12 bronze certificates, 12 silver certificates and 5 gold certificates. A special mention to Umair (Year 7) and Vivek (Year 8) who got the best score in their year groups, and to Safia (Year 8) who got the best score overall. A huge well done to all the students who participated in the challenge!


#### **National School Sports Week 2020**


celebrating sport and wellbeing activities and a great opportunity for students to connect and compete with their family and friends virtually!




#### Wider Geography - Kew Gardens

Elephants are being brutally killed for selfish human desires stealing their tusk for ivory. Around 90% of elephants were killed in the past century for their tusks and many are still dying. 
