


Christhmas Jumper Day



UK Bebras Challenge 2020

Alperton students in Years 7, 8 and 9 participated in the UK Bebras Challenge for the first time. They were tested on their computational and mathematical thinking skills in a 40-minute online test. Their hard work and excellent aptitude for maths and computing lead to some fantastic results! Students in Year 7 collectively received 3 merits and 2 distinctions.

We had Sonali Kishor achieving the Gold award which puts her in the top 10% of all students participating (over 50 countries!) in her age group. Students in Year 8 collectively received 2 merits and 4 distinctions. Students in Year 9 collectively received 2 merits and 1 distinction.

We had Safia Habibi achieving the Gold award which also puts her in the top 10% of all students participating in her age group. A really big well done to all students involved! We look forward to more of our students participating next year!
