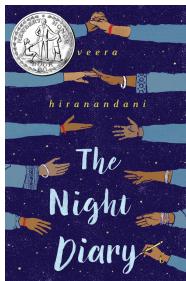
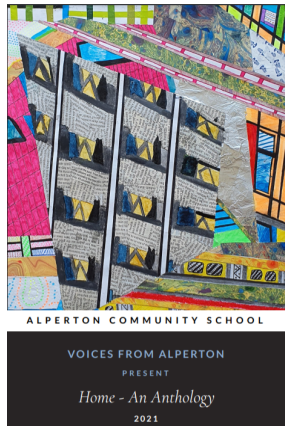
Overdue Books!
