


### Expanded Safeguarding Team

## Safeguarding in focus : Knife Crime

The focus on knife crime has been a constant across Lonson for a number of years. But why do young people decide to carry a knife and what are the consequences?

**99% of young people in England and Wales live knife free.** And, while those that carry often claim to do it to feel safer, carrying a knife can get you into dangerous situations. If you've considered carrying a knife – or are already carrying – there are things you need to think about. While some people and places make you feel like you need to carry, it's never worth it.



Real Stories is a series of short films produced by young people who have been involved with knives. ## Peer-on-Peer Sexual Abuse : Everyone's Invited

You may have seen in the news that as a response to the website Everyone's Invited, Ofsted were asked to conduct a review into sexual abuse. The result of the review was 7 recommendations for schools. In June 2021 we conducted a full review of our Safeguarding provision and included these recommendations from Ofsted. The review has given school a clear understanding of our many strengths but also some areas where we can improve - some with the help of parents / carers at home. We will, at first, conduct a survey of all students by the end of term to gain a better understanding of their experiences and perceptions which will then be used in our planning for next year. This will allow us to ensure that our students understand what sexual abuse is, e.g. from inappropriate physical contact to name calling, and what to do about it when they experience or see it being done to others.
