How do you assess the learning?

Formative assessments: opportunities to improve knowledge and skills as part of preparation for formal assessments using detailed teacher feedback. Teachers check students' understanding for each lesson with activities designed to test the learning. In addition, teachers will revisit skills throughout the year to maintain the students' knowledge.

Mid-Year Assessment: an opportunity for the students to show what they have learnt for reading and writing. These assessments are marked and moderated by teachers to ensure fairness. The agreed grades are then put on the students' trackers.
