What will be studied?
Topic(s)
Term 1 and Term 2: Anglo-Saxon England and Norman Invasion – Beginning with Anglo-Saxon society students will investigate how society operated in 1060. They will then study the impact of Edward the Confessor's death and how William the Conqueror came to become king. Students will then go on to study how William I established control and all the challenges he faced. Finally they will evaluate Norman England and all the changes that were made by William I up until his death. Term 3: London during WWII and Challenges for Britain and the wider world - Students will study the challenges British democracy faced from the Nazi regime. They will study local history and the impact of bombings on society. They will then go on to study an eclectic course of various global events and how this has shaped the modern world; for example the US Civil Rights.
