Re: Covid - 19 vaccination for children aged 12 +

Dear parents,

We are aware your child has been offered the COVID-19 vaccination in school, but you may have chosen for your child not to be vaccinated as you were unable to be present. We're giving you the opportunity for you to attend a clinic with your child in several sites across Brent with longer opening hours.

COVID -19 is usually mild in most children, but it can make some children unwell. 1 dose of the COVID -19 vaccine gives good protection against your child getting seriously ill, but 2 doses gives stronger and longer lasting protection. Vaccinating children can also help stop the spread of COVID-19 to other people, including within schools.
