## PEARSON NATIONAL TEACHING AWARDS

We are delighted to announce that Alperton Community School has been named as one of 80 Pearson National Teaching Award Silver Award winners across the country. Alperton is honoured with a Silver Award in the Award for 'Making a Difference – Secondary School of the Year for their outstanding commitment to changing the lives of the children they work with every day'.

Our school is one of the most ethnically diverse places in the country with 130 languages spoken in the school. Students achieve qualifications, employability skills and cross-community experiences by setting high aspirations through an excellent careers provision, an extensive pastoral care programme and high quality teaching and learning.

As a Silver Award winner, Alperton Community School has now been shortlisted to win one of just 16 Gold Awards later in the year. These once in a lifetime achievements will be broadcast on the BBC's The One Show as part of a week-long celebration of teaching, which sees famous faces honour award winners every night in the run up to the ceremony.

The Silver Award winners were honoured as part of the wider celebrations for national 'Thank a Teacher Day', bringing together everyone across the country to celebrate the schools and colleges at the heart of our communities.

The Pearson National Teaching Awards is an annual celebration of excellence in education, founded in 1998 by Lord Puttnam to recognise the life-changing impact an inspirational teacher can have on the lives of the young people they work with. This year marks its 23rd year of celebrating school teaching staff across the UK.

Thank you to Ms Ernestine and Ms Kipling for the fabulous music and drama performances.
