The tasks will also give you a good idea of whether the course suits you.

- 2. Read the guidance carefully and attempt everything the teacher has set even if you think you may be doing it incorrectly or imperfectly. The most successful Sixth Form students are those who take responsibility over their learning and are resilient when facing challenges
- 3. Be mindful that these tasks will form 50% of your first assessment. Non submission will result in a 0 mark Completing these tasks will help your teachers review your potential for the course you have selected.
- 4. Organise your time so that you can complete the <u>Sixth Form Preparation Assignments</u> for all subjects you wish to study. Organisation and Self Management are the key to success in the Sixth Form. The more organised you are the easier your courses will feel.
