Course Description

What will be studied?

Paper 1: Literary Genres - Aspects of Tragedy

The study of Aspects of Tragedy in three texts, which must include a Shakespeare text, a second drama text and one further text, of which one must be written pre-1900. The examination will be closed book.

Paper 2: Texts and Genres - Elements of Political and Social Protests

The study of Elements of social and political protest writing in three texts, which must include one post-2000 prose text; one poetry and one further text, one of which must be written pre-1900. The examination will be open book.

NEA (Non-Exam Assessment)

Two essays between 1200-1500 words each responding to a different text of your choice, linking to a different aspect of the Critical anthology. One text must be prose and the other must be poetry. One essay can be re-creative. The re-creative piece must be accompanied by a commentary.

Entry requirements

The minimum entry requirement will be six GCSE qualifications at Grades 5 - 9. In addition to this, students will be expected to achieve a grade 6 or above in English Language and/or English Literature.
