Year 12 [One Year Programme]

These are the Units of Work / Modules we study in Year 12:

Unit 1: Principles of working in Health, Social Care and ChildCare: The fundamental principles required to ensure delivery of high quality care and support by all practitioners.

Unit 2: Health and Safety in Practice: Understanding of Health and Safety in practice.

Unit 3: Working in a Person Centred way: Knowledge of how the person centred approach taken by the Health & Social Care sector enables practitioners to provide person-centred care.

Unit 4: Safeguarding: Gaining skills to identify abuse and neglect as well as the knowledge of how to deal with disclosures or suspicions of abuse or neglect appropriately.

Unit 7: Working in Childcare environments: An introduction to providing good quality care in childcare environments and how to make a positive difference in children's lives.

Unit 8: Working with children in a ChildCare environment: This unit will help you to develop the professional skills you need to organise day-to-day experiences for children within a setting.

Entry Requirements

Students must complete the Year 12 Summer Preparation Task before beginning the course.

TThe minimum entry requirement will be 5 GCSE qualifications at Grade 3 including English Language and for Mathematics, a grade of 1-2. In addition, students will be expected to commit to a weekly work experience in an appropriate setting for the duration of this course as well as Grade 2-4 in related subjects studied at GCSE.
