




A presentation from the year 12 Textiles students

African Americans have been quilting since they were brought to America as slaves and needed to keep warm. Enslaved people stitched together pieces from worn-out clothes to create blankets.

Bisa Butler's quilted artworks are made from African fabrics from Ghana, batiks from Nigeria, and prints from South Africa.


To make her fabric artwork, she traces over photographs, then she layers and stitches fabrics with a sewing machine, a process called appliqué to create her large scale quilts.



Bisa Butler says about her work:

"African Americans have been marginalized for hundreds of years. While we have been right beside our white counterparts experiencing and creating history, our contributions and perspectives have been ignored, unrecorded and lost. It is only a few years ago that it was acknowledged that the White house was built by slaves.

The people in my portraits are African Americans from ordinary walks of life. Like the builders of the White House, they have no names or captions to tell us who they were. I want to give the people in my artworks their ancestry back, taking their place in American history"




Year 12 student work: Niki Cangi
