I understand that if I damage any school property, that my parents/carers will be expected to pay for the damage. • Always move around the school building in a calm and sensible manner. • Always keep to school zones allocated to my year group including entrances, playgrounds, canteen, stairs and toilets. • Eat healthy food in school, on the way to school and going home from school. • Keep my mobile phone at home or switched-off in my school bag. • Adhere to the ACS ICT E-safe and acceptable use policy. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be courteous and polite whenever communicating with school staff. • Inform the school immediately of any changes to contact details including address and phone numbers. • Ensure that your child attends school on time, in the correct uniform and that they are properly equipped for all lessons including Sport and Health. • Encourage your child to work hard and support them by discussing their school work and homework with them every day. • Set the highest possible standards for attendance and ensure that holidays are only taken in the allocated holiday weeks as indicated on the school calendar. • Telephone the attendance officer/use MCAS to immediately contact the school if your child is unable to attend. • Attend all parent evenings and events and take a full part in discussions about your child's well-being and progress. • Support the school's healthy eating policy by either providing healthy packed lunches or ensuring that your child uses the school's cashless dining facilities; by not giving your child money to buy food on the way home from school. • Do not allow your child to bring a smartphone to school. Students are expected to bring a basic phone to school without internet access. • Alert the school immediately if there are any special circumstances that may affect your child's learning. • Work in partnership with the school to promote the highest standards of behaviour for your child. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop students who are READY, RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE and RESILIENT so that they are ready to make a positive contribution to society locally, nationally and internationally. • Put measures in place to secure the safety and welfare of all our students. • Provide a broad, balanced and rich curriculum. • Make lessons relevant, interesting and accessible to all of our students. • Celebrate the successes of our students regularly and use sanctions as a last resort. • Regularly assess the standards your child has reached and celebrate the progress made by your child. Give students the opportunity to improve their work after assessments. • Keep parents/ carers informed about the standard attained and progress made by their child on a regular basis. • Treat everyone in our school community with respect and to have high expectations for all our students regardless of their starting point. • Use every opportunity to intervene where students need to catch up so that no child is left behind. • Develop the personal and social skills in our students and enhance their self-discipline and independent study skills.
