<p>As a <b>STUDENT</b> at Alperton Community School, I agree to be <b>READY, RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE and RESILIENT</b> at all times. I agree to:</p>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Be courteous, polite and take responsibility for myself and my learning.</li> <li>● Complete work, including homework, to the best of my ability and make sure any work missed due to absence is up to date.</li> <li>● Arrive punctually no later than 8:25am for the start of the school day.</li> <li>● Arrive punctually for the start of all my lessons.</li> <li>● Wear my school uniform with pride to school, throughout the school day and on the way to school and on the way home from school.</li> <li>● Always have the correct equipment e.g. pens, pencils, sports kit and reading book.</li> <li>● Actively support the school's environment and sustainability procedures e.g. picking up litter and recycling wherever possible.</li> <li>● Always take care of school property. I understand that if I damage any school property (either accidentally or intentionally), that my parents/carers will be expected to pay for the damage.</li> <li>● Move around the school building in a calm and sensible manner.</li> <li>● Always keep to school zones allocated to my year group including entrances, playgrounds, canteen, stairs and toilets.</li> <li>● Eat healthy food in school and not purchase or eat unhealthy food on the way to school or on the way home from school.</li> <li>● If my parents/carers allow me to bring a mobile device to school, I will ensure it is not internet-enabled and it is switched-off in my school bag until I am no longer on the school premises. I am aware that if my phone is seen in school it will be confiscated and my parents/carer will be invited to collect it from school.</li> <li>● Maintain the highest standards of behaviour in public (on the way to school, on the way home from school, using public transport or during school trips)</li> <li>● Make my way home by the quickest route without loitering or stopping in any of the local shops.</li> <li>● Walk to school and walk home from school wherever possible, but walk at least one bus stop every day.</li> <li>● Participate in at least one club each term.</li> <li>● Engage positively in all events and activities arranged for you by the school e.g. mentoring; after-school club.</li> <li>● Inform the DSL, a PM, Head of Year, or a member of staff if I am concerned about the welfare or well-being of another student, or if I am concerned something may happen to them.</li> <li>● Follow the school's commute agreement when moving between school sites.</li> </ul>

## Home School Agreement 2023

As a **PARENT/CARER** of a child at Alperton Community School, I agree to support my child to be **READY, RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE and RESILIENT** at all times. I agree to:

- Be courteous and polite whenever communicating with school staff.
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to contact details including address and phone numbers.
- Ensure that my child attends school on time, in the correct uniform and that they are properly equipped for all lessons including Sport and Health.
- Encourage my child to work hard and support them by discussing their school work and homework with them every day.
- Set the highest possible standards for attendance and ensure that holidays are only taken in the allocated school holiday weeks as indicated on the school calendar.
- Telephone the attendance officer or use MCAS to immediately contact the school if my child is unable to attend.
- Attend all parent evenings and events and take a full part in discussions about my child's well-being and progress.
- Support the school's healthy eating policy by either providing healthy packed lunches or ensuring that my child uses the school's cashless dining facilities
- Support the school's healthy eating policy by not giving my child money to buy food on the way home from school.
- By not allowing my child to bring an internet-enabled phone or device to school. If I want my child to have access to a phone or device on the way to school or on the way home it will be a basic phone without internet access.
- Collect any confiscated items from school e.g. non-uniform items or internet-enabled mobile devices.
- Alert the school immediately if there are any special circumstances that may affect my child's learning or wellbeing.
- Work in partnership with the school to promote the highest standards of behaviour for my child.
- Allow my child to attend off-site school visits.
- Agree for and encourage my child to fully participate in the school's PSHE curriculum and extra-curricular activities.
- Agree for my child to attend intervention sessions that may take place after school/ during the school holidays.
- Pay for damage my child has caused.
