- I. Be courteous and polite whenever communicating with school staff.
- 2. Inform the school immediately of any changes to contact details including address and phone numbers.
- 3. Ensure that my child attends school on time, in the correct uniform and that they are properly equipped for all lessons including Sport and Health.
- 4. Encourage my child to work hard and support them by discussing their school work/homework/home learning/online tasks/assessments/evaluations/surveys with them every day and monitoring their achievement and behaviour points on MCAS.
