- The days of a lifelong career with one company or within one industry have gone.






If you achieve Grades 5 to 9 in the EBacc subjects you will receive an EBacc Certificate.

Career Planning

Many of us don't know what we wish to do when we are 13 or 14 years old although, a few of us may have very clear ideas.

In Year 9, getting curious and exploring what is possible is probably the best thing you can do, to help yourself to develop some career ideas. You can do this in lots of different ways, from talking to people you know about their jobs and looking at different websites to help you explore your initial career ideas such as Unifrog. Being good at subjects and/or enjoying them

Take subjects you are good at and/or enjoy often means you will gain higher grades in these areas, increasing the range of options available to you at post-16. You may also have a more enjoyable time in school during your studies, thereby having a better quality of life and fewer concerns with regards to your mental health due to stress or worry.

Which 'build' skills you wish to develop

Certain subjects are highly useful in developing transferable skills for the future, often being useful in more than one setting. For example, studying history allows you to learn about historical events but also enables you to develop your analytical, comprehension and essay skills; all of which are desirable in careers requiring these skills such as areas of law and business.





As a skill for life

An alternative way to choose subjects, is to consider whether these are things you wish to take with you as a broader life skill or just for fun. For example, you may take Spanish because you plan to travel when you are older, rather than because you wish to work as a translator or within international business.

Lastly, you may choose a subject because it forms the foundation for a career, such as taking art for a career in architecture. Aspire Commit Succeed

Ms Cathcart - Being Prepared for GCSEs



- ★ Great attendance leads to great achievement!
- ★ If your child has 90% attendance, this equates to your child missing ½ a school day each week.
- ★ Over a year this would mean your child would miss four weeks of school at least 100 hours of their learning.
- ★ Research suggests that missing 17 school days a year results in students dropping at least one grade

ACS expects all students to have at least 96% attendance.





- Students should be at school by 8:20 AM
- They should be heading to their from class by 8:25 am
- Uniform is checked if there is an issue, a note should be provided
- If students are not in form class at the beginning of form, they are marked as late
- A late detention will be given if necessary
