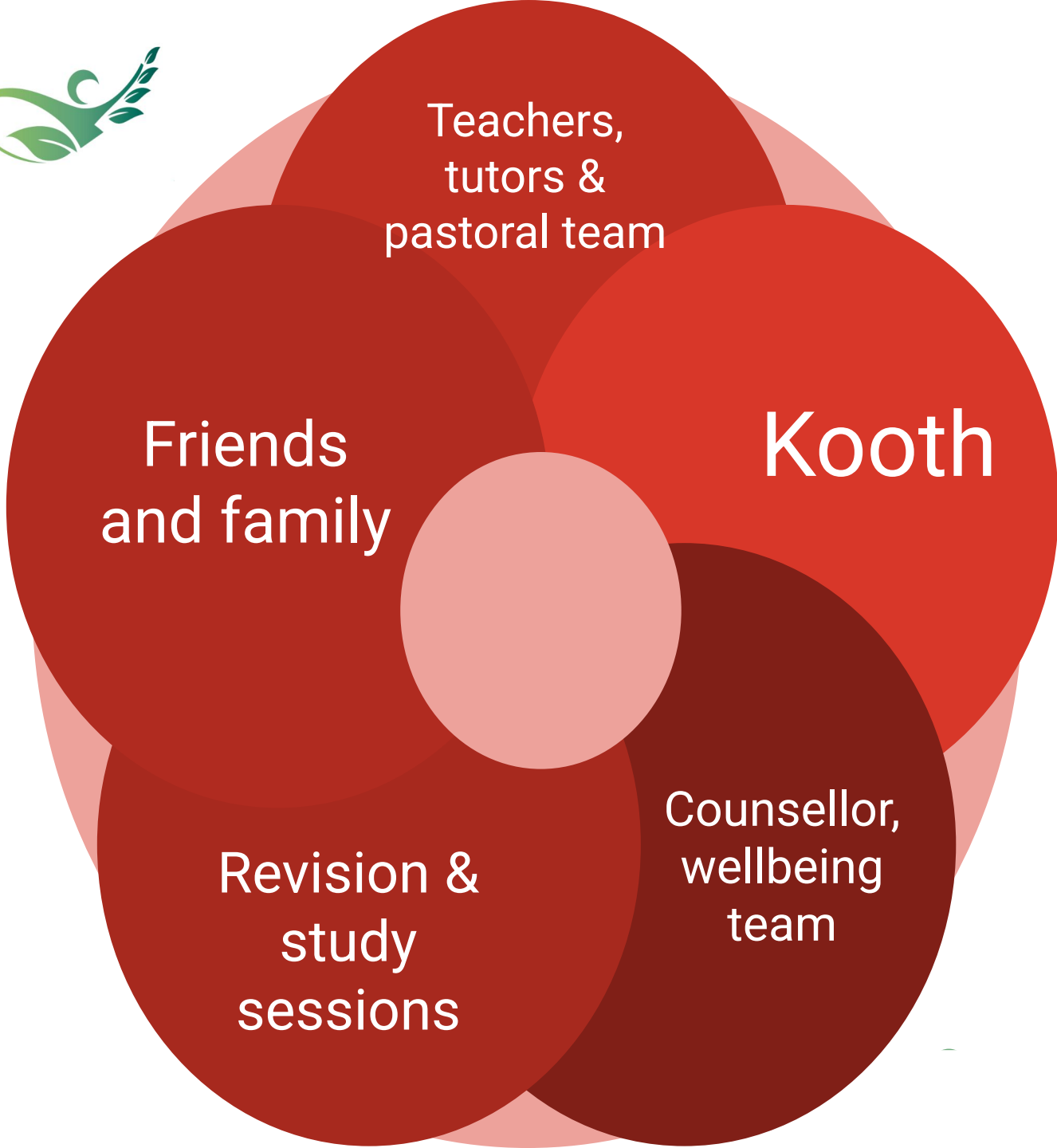

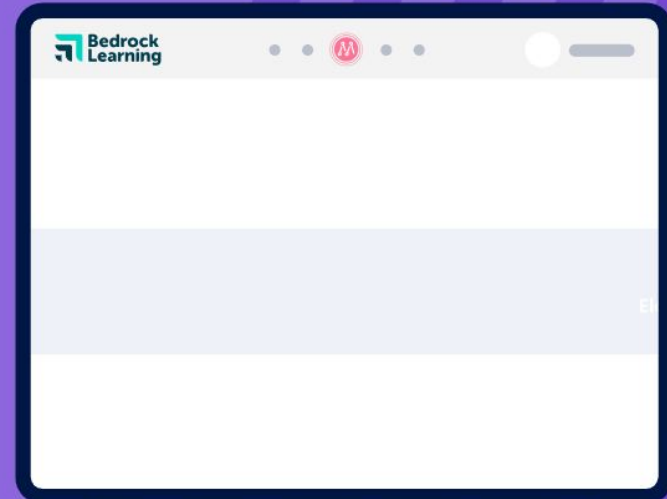

Students can remain in funded education up to the age of 19 which means they can complete a Level 1 / 2 programme (1 year) and then progress into Level 3 (2 Years)
