 **Subject Teachers** – for insight into course content, expectations, and suitability.

 **Teaching and Learning Leaders** – for expert advice on subject progression and curriculum details.

 **Pastoral Manager for Year 9** – for support in balancing workload, well-being, and aspirations.

 **Senior Leaders** – for overarching guidance on GCSE pathways and future opportunities.

Additionally, students will attend **informative subject presentations** for courses they have not previously studied, providing valuable insights to help them decide.

Selecting Reserve Subjects

While we strive to allocate each student their **first-choice subjects**, availability may be affected by factors such as **course demand, class sizes, and timetable constraints**. To ensure a smooth process, students must also **select reserve subjects**, which will be considered if their preferred options cannot be accommodated.

Clear instructions on how to complete the selection process will be provided to all students and parents.

Careful consideration should be given to both main choices and reserves to maintain a balanced and enjoyable learning experience.

Year 9 Options: How Do They Work?

Your GCSE Journey

As students enter **Years 10 and 11**, their timetable will include a combination of **compulsory** and **optional** subjects, shaping their academic future and career pathways.

At **Alperton Community School**, we provide a **broad and balanced curriculum**, allowing students to select subjects that match their interests, strengths, and aspirations.

Compulsory Subjects

All students will study the following **core subjects** as part of their GCSE curriculum:






- English Language**
- English Literature**
- Mathematics**
- Combined or Triple Science**
- Sport & Health – Non-examined**

These subjects form the foundation of every student's academic profile and are essential for future studies and employment.

What is the EBacc?

The **English Baccalaureate (EBacc)** is a set of subjects that universities and employers look for. While it is not compulsory, students are **encouraged** to consider this pathway.

The **EBacc subjects** include:

-  **English Language**
-  **Mathematics**
-  **Science (Combined or Triple)**
-  **History or Geography (One MUST be chosen)**
-  **A Modern Foreign Language (French, Spanish, or Gujarati)**

Why choose the EBacc?

- ✓ Keeps future career and study options open.
- ✓ Recognised by universities and employers.

Students who achieve **Grade 5 or above** in these subjects will have access to a **wide range of A-levels** and **university options**.


Choosing Your Options

In addition to the **compulsory subjects**, students will choose **four option subjects** from the list below.

-  **One of these MUST be either History or Geography.**
-  **Students are encouraged to choose a Language.**



 **Important:** Some subjects have limited spaces and may be **oversubscribed**. If a student's first-choice subject is unavailable, a **reserve option** will be used.

Key Considerations When Choosing Options

- ✓ **What are your strengths?** – Choose subjects you enjoy and excel in.
- ✓ **What are your future aspirations?** – Consider how subjects align with career paths or A-level choices.
- ✓ **Do you want to achieve the EBacc?** – Think about how this could support future university applications.
- ✓ **Do you prefer coursework or exams?** – Some subjects have more coursework-based assessments (e.g., BTEC courses).

Oversubscribed Courses

There are a set number of places for each course. These are allocated primarily on a first come, first served basis. After this, other factors may be taken into account, such as previous attainment, progress and attitude to learning.

Undersubscribed Courses

If only a small number of students opt for a course, it may not be possible for it to run.

Changing Options

The timetable will have been created, subject groups will be full, work will have been missed and other subjects will be affected negatively. Hence, we cannot make changes.
