



## What will you learn?

### Topic(s)

#### Term 1

**Map Making:** Students are introduced to the essential skills of mapmaking, a foundational aspect of understanding and interpreting the world around them.

**Geography of UK and local area:** Students will examine the various human and physical characteristics of places in the UK. They will explore how people interact with these places and how their own sense of place has developed.

#### Term 2

**Development:** Students will explore the concept of development, focusing on how and why different regions of the world develop at varying rates.

**Weather and Climate:** Students will understand the differences between weather and climate and the factors affecting climate

#### Term 3

**World of Work:** Students will learn about employment sectors globally, understanding how different industries contribute to the world of work.

**Middle East:** Students will develop a deeper understanding of its unique characteristics and its place within the broader global landscape.

## How will you be assessed?

### Overall assessment

Students will be formally assessed at the end of each unit of work, focussing on the content that they have covered during the half term. However, teachers will also use ongoing, formative assessment throughout all lessons.

### End of Year assessment

Our end of year examination is an hour long assessment.



## Which resources should you use?

### Books, websites, online resources, trips and visits

## What independent work can you do?

### Books, websites, online resources

Use the VIP Zone, there you will find:

- An 'Independent Learning' folder full of resources and ideas to support your learning
- PLCs [Personal Learning Checks] - use these to rate your understanding of each topic and to recap and stretch your knowledge and skills.

Start revising. Try some of these to improve your understanding of each lesson and to help you prepare for assessments.

- **Summarise your notes:** Identify the key ideas and essential details. This technique improves understanding and retention by making information clearer and more manageable.
- **Flashcards:** Write key information on cards, don't forget to include an example
- **Mind maps:** Visually organize information by creating diagrams that connect ideas. This helps you see the relationships between topics.
- **Mnemonics:** Use songs, rhymes, or acronyms to help remember facts and figures.
- **Recording and replaying:** Record yourself reading notes and listen back to them.
- **Sticky notes:** Write / draw a key point on each note and place them around your house to help with memorisation.
