

Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 13 students have now begun their formal A Level and vocational examinations. To support them during this important period, we are running pre-exam revision workshops delivered by subject teachers before each exam. A weekly timetable will be published on the Year 13 Google Classroom.

Students are expected to attend all timetabled lessons until they have completed their final exam in each subject. These sessions focus on exam practice, active recall, model answers, and key strategies for success.

At home, please ensure your child is following an effective revision programme, with a focus on active recall. This should include:

- Completing exam practice papers from memory
- Improving answers using mark schemes and notes
- Recalling and summarising content from memory

Simply reading notes is not an effective revision strategy.

We are also providing a free breakfast in the canteen from 8:00am–8:30am. Students with afternoon exams may access the canteen from 1:00pm to eat, rest, and prepare.

Please support your child's wellbeing by encouraging:

- Regular, healthy meals
- A consistent sleep routine and regular breaks
- Staying hydrated throughout the day

Students with attendance of 90% or above, and who have demonstrated consistent punctuality, will be eligible for flexi-study from **11 May 2026**. This will allow them to study independently during timetabled study periods.

Study leave during tutor time will begin on 25 May 2026 for all students, unless there are exceptional concerns regarding attitude to learning, punctuality and attendance.

On behalf of the Sixth Form team, it has been a pleasure supporting students throughout their journey. We wish them every success in their examinations and look forward to celebrating their next steps into higher education, apprenticeships, and employment.

Exams.

AM exams begin at 8.45am Students line up in the relevant place by 8.20am & are seated by 8.30am
PM exams begin at 1.45pm Students line up in the relevant place by 1.20pm & are seated by 1.30pm

Running Late / Unwell on Exam Day

All students are expected to arrive 20 minutes before an exam so they have a calm start to their exam. If your child is delayed or unwell on the day of their exam please telephone us on **0208 902 2038 (212/ 213)**. If you are unable to get through to a member of the Sixth Form Team please leave a message with reception

Missing an exam due to ill health / other reason

Please note exam boards will not organise catch up exams for any students. If your child misses an exam they will receive an X for that paper and this will impact their overall grade. If there is a significant illness or other unforeseen circumstance please contact the **Exams Manager / Year Lead** as soon as possible.

Lessons and Study Periods

All timetabled lessons continue to go ahead as normal until the final exam in that subject is completed. Students with attendance of 90% or above will be granted flexi-study from 11th May 2026, allowing them to study independently during timetabled study periods. Study leave during tutor time will begin on 25th May 2026 for all students.

Results Collection

A Level results will be available on **13th August 2026 from 8.30am–11:00am**. Students who are not able to attend school during this time should contact the **Exams Manager, Ms S. Chopra**, in advance to arrange alternative methods of accessing their results.

The Sixth Form team is unable to advise on results collection or facilitate access to results or certificates.

Support with Exam Grades

All queries relating to exam grades should be directed to the Exams Manager, Ms S. Chopra. This includes enquiries about marks, review of marking requests, and access to examination scripts. The Sixth Form team is unable to access this information or advise on these matters.

University Application Service (UCAS)

Students will be able to view updates on their university applications via the UCAS 'Track' service using their UCAS account. This will be available from 8:00am on Results Day.

Confirming Your University Place (UCAS TRACK)

After receiving your results, you will be in one of the following positions:

- Accepted by your firm choice [Which you can accept / reject]
- Offered a changed course [Which you can accept / reject]
- Accepted by your insurance choice [Which you can accept / reject]
- Declined by both choices / not holding any offers [*Making you eligible for clearing*]

If you have any queries about your offer, you should contact the university or college directly. Contact information for the admissions team can be found on individual university admissions pages. The Sixth Form is unable to advise on individual University / Apprenticeship Admissions decisions.
