The Headteacher started the meeting by explaining how busy the term had been. School hosted a European 'BeHave Project' conference twice. There have been cleaning issues, staff illness that was problematic due to reduced numbers available to provide cover due to budget cuts.

## **Arbor Information System**

The school is looking at replacing the office management information and assessment data system. The present systems; RM INtegris and Target Tracker are not integrated and rather long winded. The new system proposed system is Arbor Education.

#### a)Implementation Study

All data would eventually be in one place which would be easily accessible. There would be no more paper registers. All services will not be implemented at once in case there are problems. School Money is working well and will not change straight away. During the first year there will be extra costs, as the software will have to run alongside each other for a transition period, plus training costs. The school will need to serve notice to RM.

- Assessment including analysis
- Attendance
- Data Management
- Behaviour
- Email Client
- Parent Evening Bookings

The Head and IT Lead has visited St Paul's School to see the process.

Governors thought that this was a very promising tool that would benefit the school. Governors queried how pupils and staff would be checked during a fire practice. Craig responded that the information is easily accessible on a phone or a tablet.

#### **New Ofsted Framework 2019**

- Deep Dives, looking at Wider Curriculum areas in depth.

Carol Price pointed out this will have an impact on staff wanting to take on Curriculum areas of responsibility.

Arbor The school have signed up to Arbor and served notice on RM

**SPP** Schools Partnership Programme Review. Focus on Writing. WEBB review day led by Barnfield, with Broadfields and Edgware also present. The outcomes were positive, with lots of strengths identified. Two areas have been identified for improvement.

- Ensure effective modelling of writing and the editing process across the school.
- Develop a consistent structure that allows children to use feedback to effectively improve their work and enable better final drafts.

#### **Standards Data Review:**

**EYFSP** Good level of development, 62.5% achieving GLD, decrease by 5.8%, 9.3% lower than National. Percentile 65th.

#### **Phonics**

Continue to be very good. 89.8% achieving

# **Key Stage 1 SATS Outcomes**

Reading 76.8% achieving expected standard. 1.9% higher than National. Percentile 36. Writing 66.1% achieving expected standard. 3.1% lower than National. Percentile 46. Maths 69.6% achieving expected standard. 6% lower than National. Percentile 51.

## **Key stage 2 SATS Outcomes**

60% achieving in all 3 subjects, Reading , Writing and Maths. 4.8% lower than national.

Reading progress +1.6 66.7% achieving expected standard

Writing progress -0.2 76.7% achieved expected standard

Maths progress +1.0 88.3% achieving expected standard

School will be preparing a self evaluation report for the Local Authority which the Governors will see.

### School Development Plan 2019-2020

This will be continuing with the new plan developed last year and fits in well with the new Ofsted framework.
