Nursery & Reception Tasks

- This week we are going to be making pancakes. We will be really listening to instructions on how to stay safe around the hot oven, what ingredients we need and what to do with the ingredients. We will be using all of our senses and using our words to describe what is happening, what we can smell, feel, hear and taste. Can you tell me what you could small, feel, hear and taste when you were making your pancakes?
- Mr Wolf has some very unhelpful neighbours in the story. You have been at home for a long time now and I'd like to know how you have been helpful around the house, it might be helping with the washing, cleaning, cooking or tidying. Remember a problem shared is a problem halved.

- Can you describe a pancake? Is it flat? Round? Hot? Cold? Beige? Brown? Disgusting? Delicious?

In the story we meet some other characters from traditional tales and stories. Do you know the stories that they come from? Can you sing the rhyme that they belong too? Wolves in stories usually get categorised as the bad guys, can you find a story where Mr Wolf is a bad guy? Do you think he was a bad guy in this story? Why/Why not? Would you have let your neighbours in?

Literacy	Nursery Tasks

Mix a Pancake, Stir a Pancake, Pop it in the Pan; Fry a Pancake, Toss a Pancake, Catch it if you can!	 This week we will be looking at the ingredients that make a pancake. We will be looking at the logos and print that are on these ingredients and the importance of a recipe. We will discuss what we need to put into the mix and learn the recipe together and a song to help us make the perfect pancake. We will continue with our initial sounds and rhyming words through lots of games. Keep a lookout on Dojo for these activities.
Literacy	 Reception Tasks The first task of the week will be to read a recipe. This will help us to measure our ingredients and follow instructions to make a perfect pancake. We will use this experience to write our own list of ingredients, order form and recipes. A ditty a day is the Dunn Street way. Don't forget to do your daily reading tasks to become speedy readers. We will be learning 5 new sounds this week. They will be our set 2 sounds and will be special friends ay, ee, igh, ow, oo. Keep a lookout on the class dojo for the videos and we can learn them together. Keep reading, spelling and writing those words especially those new special friends.
Learning Objectives	L- Recognises familiar words and signs such as own name and advertising logos. Knows information can be relayed in the form of print R-Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning, representing some sounds correctly and in sequence.
Mathematics	 Nursery Tasks We will start our week off by singing 5 little pancakes. We will then ask the children do they want cream or chocolate on their pancake? We will make a note of this as a class and compare. Do more children want chocolate or cream? We will then be comparing pancake piles and using mathematical vocabulary. Who has the most? Who has the least? Who has the fewest? We will then discuss if the groups are fair. Is it fair that Miss Bridges gets 2 pancakes and Mrs Fox gets one? How can we make it fair? We will continue to count to 10 forwards and backwards.
Mathematics	We will start our week by making a bar chart of our favourite pancake toppings. Which one will be the favourite? We will then solve some addition and subtraction problems for Mr Wolf. How many pancakes will he need for his party? How many pancakes will he have left if he eats 2?

Learning Objectives	 We will be counting forwards and backwards in 1's to 20. Mr Wolf needs to go to the shop to pay for his shopping so we are going to be starting to look at real money, counting and ordering the coins we find. N- Compares two groups of objects, saying when they have the same number. R-In practical activities and discussion, beginning to use the
	vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting.
Understanding the World Shrove Tuesday	 Nursery & Reception Tasks Shrove Tuesday passed by last week. We will be discussing the importance of Lent and what this means for Christians. We will also be discussing what Lent leads up to and ask any questions that we would like to find out about Easter. We are going to use Smartnotebook to make a graph of what toppings we liked the best. Look out for our graph on the Class Dojo and find out which one was our favourite. which topping would you have chosen?
