Having an awareness of the risks online is essential for parents or carers of young people to help keep young people safe in our care whilst engaging in the online space.

Prevent is a safeguarding approach to prevent young people and vulnerable adults from being exploited into extremist activities, it seeks to safeguard the individual from the risks and help address and vulnerabilities that may be being exploited by others. If you have concerns and believe a young person or vulnerable adult is at risk of radicalisation please contact your local authority safeguarding team or alternatively contact Cleveland Police on 101 Remember sharing concerns is not criminalising a young person or vulnerable adult its safeguarding them.

As many of us all make use of our online community in our daily lives whether it is for social media, gaming or shopping we all have a part to play in keeping our online community safe. Therefore if you see extremist content online having an awareness of how to report it is essential if you are to help police remove such material.
