

Today we were thinking about the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' again. The children were so good at joining in with the repeated parts of the story, they even used actions to help them retell it...



“Little pig, little pig, let me
come in!”



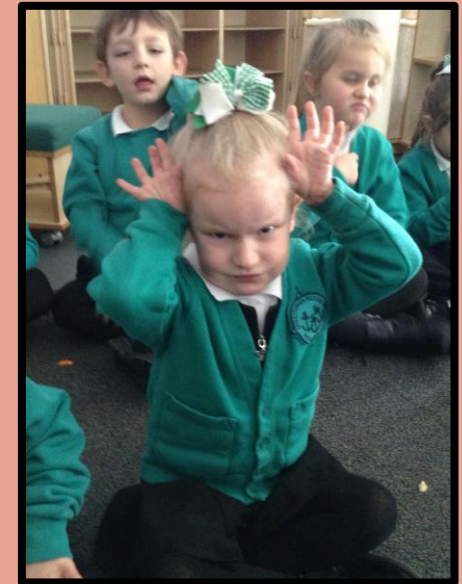
“No, no! Not by the hair on
my chinny-chin-chin. I will
not let you in!”



“Then I will huff and I will puff
and I will blow your house
down!”



We then thought about the characters in the book. Lottie told us that the Three Little Pigs were good but Amelia told us that the Wolf was a bad character!



We tried hard, as always, to use full sentences, starting with “The wolf is a bad character because...”

Payton : ...he is bad.

Aliza : ...he is scary.

Arriea : ...he’s trying to eat the pigs, he’s a ‘meaney’.

Isabella : ...the wolf is naughty and nasty.

Layla : ...he’s horrible.

Finley : ...he’s greedy.

The children did really well at trying to think of descriptive vocabulary.

We then thought about the 3rd Little Pig who had built his house of bricks. This was actually a bit more tricky! We started our sentences with "The pig is a good character because..."

Maisie : ...he is kind. (Why?) Because he let the other pigs in his house to hide from the wolf.

Eric : ...he is good. (Why?)

Amelia : he is good at building houses.

We then talked about the fact that the pig might be described as 'hardworking'.

We also talked about his choice of building materials. With some support, Isabella described him as 'sensible'.
