Beatrice Subsea Engineer - EniProgetti

What does the role involve?

 My day to day work includes developing and modelling offshore energy fields, deciding which structures are going to be used and where they are going to be placed on the seabed. I

also make sure that the design of the structures is strong enough to stop oil and gas escaping and is safe to use.

- Every day I work with a team of engineers trying to overcome problems, we share ideas and come up with solutions for all type of issues.
- Some days my job brings me to sites, where the huge structures installed on the seabed are built and I also witness the tests that are done at very high temperatures and pressures to make sure the design is safe.

Entry Routes

- Gain a degree in engineering, usually Mechanical, Aerenotical/Aerospace, Process engineering.
- Subjects suggested at A levels: Physics, Maths, Biology, Chemistry, Computing, Economics, Electronics, Environmental Science, Geography, Geology Human Biology, Statistics,
