
Nursery Tasks

Reception Tasks

- A ditty a day is the Dunn Street way. Don't forget to do your daily reading tasks to become speedy readers.
- We will be learning 5 new sounds this week. They will be our set 2 sounds and will be special friends ar, or, air, ir and ou. Keep a lookout on the class dojo for the videos and we can learn them together.
- Keep reading, spelling and writing those words especially those new special friends.
- We will be writing onomatopoeias...yes a very long word for our reception children. These will be used to write words for Super Daisy as she attacks the evil peas.
- Your next writing task will be to draw a picture of Super Daisy and write a sentence about what you have drawn.
- You have a picture of Super Daisy in your pack. What is she doing? Write a sentence to match the picture.
- Finally you will be writing a sentence about a real life hero called Captain Tom. Look out for the video about his life and you can tell me why he is a hero.
- It's also world book day so take part in our Early Years and whole school masked reader challenges.

Nursery Tasks



- We will start our week off by singing 5 little ladybirds sitting on a leaf.
- We will then create ladybird headbands and sing our new song.
- We will then look at a poor ladybird whose spots have all fallen off. The children will have to add the correct amount of spots on. Remember it's the SAME amount on both sides.

Mathematics

Reception Tasks



- This week we will be creating a tally chart to record how many times we can pop a pea. Who will be the winner?
- We will be using peas on our ten frame and practising 'subitising' the amounts of peas we can see.
- We will be reading a counting story, so look out for it on the class doio.
- In your pack this week we have given you a number fan to make. This will help you to quickly match numerals and quantities.
- I have also included some word problems for you to read with your grown up. How many evil peas will be left?

Learning Objectives	N- Beginning to represent numbers using fingers, marks on paper or pictures. R-Can look at a group of objects and know how many there are in that set.
Understanding the World	 Nursery & Reception Tasks As we are looking at Super Daisy and talking about what makes her a hero we are going to be looking at the work and life of Captain Tom. Who is he? Do you know what makes him a hero? Is he a hero for more than one job? As we are coming to the end of our lockdown we are talking about the heroes that have made a difference to us during the pandemic. What makes a hero? How many people can be a hero? Nursery will be reflecting on the wonderful world around them. Can you spot any bugs in the garden? What do you notice about them? Can you sketch them.
Learning Objectives	UW N-• Can talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects <i>R-</i>
Expressive Arts and Design	 Nursery & Reception Tasks. This week we would like you to dress up as a hero and talk about why this person/ character is a hero. Act as that person. How do they move? Look out for us dressing up as heroes too. Our creative task this week is to draw ourselves as a superhero and to talk about the different powers we would have. What colour will your suit be? What do superheroes wear? What will your mask be like? Nursery will be focusing on sketching with charcoal next week. Can you draw a picture of a bug in your garden? Remember to look out for the little details.
