It will be up to the engineering team to diagnose the fault, get the equipment dismantled, repaired, reassembled and back into operation.







The space industry is not just for astronauts - it takes a wide variety of people and skills to make space missions and projects successful.

Join us to hear careers talks from a scientist, an engineer and a technician

During this webinar, designed for Key Stage 3 students, teachers and parents/guardians, you will learn about some of the careers available to young people in the space industry, what people do in their jobs dayto-day, what skills they use, their journey from school to their current job, and where schools can find more support. You will also have the opportunity to ask your own questions to our space team.

Speakers from RAL Space will share stories of their different career paths and explain their projects which involve innovating for the future, for example:

- · Katherine is a thermal engineer who is investigating how to use space technology to help reduce food waste in India;
- · Angela is a technician with a background in arts and crafts, now using her creative skills to make space blankets;
- · Mario is a space weather scientist, looking at the phenomena that cause the spectacular auroras (the Northern Lights).

We will be joined by Kierann Shah, manager of the National Space Academy, who will talk about the support they provide to schools to help engage young people with STEM subjects using space as the inspiration, and how they facilitate pathways into the space sector.







# Preparing for your higher education journey: Student finance & budgeting

Not sure how the student finance system works for UK students? Worried about how much university will cost? Have other questions that you'd like to ask university staff? In this session you can find out more about how student finance works, including the UK loan system, applying, and repayments.
