- English Language will develop the skills you need to read, understand and analyse a range of texts. The spoken language element of the course allows you the opportunity to develop your formal speaking skills while responding to questions.

Year 9 Options | Assessment

ENGLISH LITERATURE

Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th Century Novel

Assessed on:

- Shakespeare play
- The 19th Century Novel

1hour 45minute exam 64 marks 40% of the total GCSE Grade

Section A: Shakespeare Answer one question on *Macbeth*.

Section B: The 19th Century Novel Answer one question on *A Christmas Carol*.

Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

Assessed on:

- Modern texts (play)
- Poetry (Anthology)
- Unseen Poetry

2hour 15minute exam

96 marks

60% of the total GCSE Grade

Section A: Modern Texts

Answer one essay question from a choice of two on *An Inspector Calls*.

Section B: Poetry

Answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from the Anthology cluster.

Section C: Unseen Poetry

Answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.
