SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS









A sexually transmitted infection means an infection a person can get from another person when they do something sexual with that person.

You can only get an STI from someone who has one. You may hear 'STD or 'STI' used out in the world; the 'D refers to 'disease,' and the 'I' to infection. There are only small differences between them and we will call them STI's





Did you know?

Unprotected sex (no barrier method being used) increases greatly your chances of catching an STI's (Chlamydia, syphilis, gonorrhea and HIV)













Sexually Transmitted Infections and Diseases – FLASH CARDS

Can be spread through sexual contact, including vaginal sex, anal sex, and oral sex

STI INFORMATION

Can be CURED easily?

CHLAMYDIA GONORRHEA SYPHILIS SCABIES PUBIC LICE



STI INFORMATION

You are able to be treated but you are not yet curable

> GENITAL HERPES (HPV) HEPATITIS B HIV/AIDS



STI INFORMATION

A condom offers really good protection against it

> CHLAMYDIA GONORRHEA HEPATITIS B SYPHILIS



STI INFORMATION

One of the MOST COMMON STIS among adolescents in the UK

CHLAMYDIA HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV) GONORRHEA GENITAL HERPES

STI INFORMATION

Can be transmitted through Oral CHLAMYDIA

GONORRHEA SYPHILIS HPV GENITAL HERPES HEPATITIS B



STI INFORMATION

These can be transmitted via skin to skin contact

> GENITAL HERPES SYPHILIS PUBIC LICE

> > SCABIES



STI INFORMATION

It can cause a sore or outbreak of sores within two weeks of catching



GENITAL HERPES SYPHILIS

STI INFORMATION

SCABIES

It is caused by a parasite or bug (Not bacterial)



SCABIES PUBIC LICE

STI INFORMATION

These have vaccines



HPV HEPATITIS B

STI INFORMATION

These can be detected through a blood test



HERPES HEPATITIS B HIV/AIDS SYPHILIS
