How will I be assessed and what will I be studying?	At the end of the two year course, you will sit three two hour written exams — each exam will be worth one third of the A-level. Paper one will cover markets and market failure, paper two will cover the national and international economy and paper three will draw on material from the whole course. The papers will feature a range of question styles including, multiple choice questions, short answer questions, essay questions, data response questions and case studies.		
	You will investigate microeconomic topics such as how individual decise outcomes, the importance of competition, how markets operate and the distribution of income and wealth is affected.
