Introduction	Geography matters. It matters because it is relevant. It considers some of the most critical issues affecting the planet today, such as population growth and migration, hazard impact, globalisation and environmental degradation. What is the course about?	The A level geography curriculum enables students to explore the world, its issues and their place in it. Within this, they will be able to explore current issues of local, national and global importance in contexts specific to different parts of the world.  There is a residential fieldtrip to <b>Flatford Mill</b> to study coastal geomorphology and defences as well as urban change taking place in Colchester.  In recent years we have offered an optional trip to <b>Iceland</b> alongside year 11's to study the landscapes, and see the processes in action.
