In and around school

Moving around school and lunchtimes

When at school always remember to:

- Keep to the left
- Follow the one way system
- Walk at all times
- Enter rooms calmly and ready to learn
- Hold the door open for the person behind you
- Look after our equipment and environment
- Put litter in bins
- At Marden we expect students to have grown up toilet habits. That means you must
 make sure you go to the toilet at break times or in between lessons, they are open all of
 the time, please use them sensibly. On rare occasions or if you are poorly or on the
 medical list, where using the toilet during lessons is unavoidable, ask the teacher
 quietly for a permission card
- If you need to leave the class during lesson time for any reason you should obtain a
 green permission card from your teacher
- You are permitted to carry bottled water. Bottles can be filled at break times from our water fountains. Ask permission from your teacher if you need to drink water during lessons
- You will be advised where to go during wet break times

You can buy food and drink at Marden before school in the morning, at morning break and at lunchtime. From 8.00am in the morning you will be able to go straight to the café or remain in the East and West Yard. At 8.43am a bell will ring so students can enter the building. At break and lunch students remain in the dining hall, the games room, LRC or STEM room (Y11 only). Students are allowed outside at break and lunch, unless there are adverse weather conditions. You will be able to buy something for breakfast, if you wish. The café will also be open for snacks at morning break. When in the café:

- Use a tray
- Queue patiently and sensibly
- Eat only when sitting at a table
- Clear your table and put the tray back

At lunchtime there is an outside food outlet selling sandwiches, pasta and drinks. If you decide to eat outside, please remember that you cannot take food and drink on the field and that you must use the bins for all of your litter.

You can bring a healthy packed lunch to school but you are not allowed to bring sweets or fizzy or energy drinks to school. If you do, these will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day. You are allowed to eat your packed lunch in the auditorium or outside at a picnic table. Food and drink should not be consumed when moving around school.

If you have an accident at school, tell a member of staff or report to reception immediately. If you feel unwell please inform your teacher, if necessary the teacher will then call for ACS.

Homework @ Marden

Homework is a very important part of school life and, if done well, will result in greater achievements for you. The type of activity the teacher sets will help your learning in different ways. For example:

- Learning tasks will help you to move knowledge learnt in class from your working memory to your long term memory where it can be recalled in the future.
- Practice exercises will help build skills by repeating methods and techniques introduced in lessons
- Preparation tasks give you the opportunity to look at something before the
 lesson giving you time to think about the topic. The lesson will make more sense
 because you have done some thinking in advance
- Consolidation activities help you review what you have done in lesson and cement your understanding

All of the above give you time to think about learning outside of the classroom. This is really important for you to make progress.

As well as this, homework builds habits that you are going to need for your adult life:

- Organising and prioritising your time so that you meet deadlines
- Managing yourself to work independently when not supervised by a teacher
- Taking responsibility for your own learning and progress; accessing support materials or asking for help

Your teachers want you to complete homework because they know how beneficial it is for you to do so. However they also want you to be successful and they do not want you to struggle. That is why homework will be explained in the class when it is given out and you will be given enough time to complete it.

When homework is marked and given back to you, teachers will explain what you have done well and what you could do to improve. That way you learn from the feedback as well! Always remember to:

- Write homework in your planner
- Complete your homework thoughtfully. Think about what you are learning
- Attempt homework as soon as possible so that you have time to ask questions
- Organise all of your work to meet deadlines. Use this planner to help you
- Talk to your teacher if you are stuck
- Hand homework in on time
- Read and act upon feedback given

Effort and consistency in your homework will help you to have a growth mind-set.

In your life you will always be learning, homework teaches you how to do this independently.

Polishable black school shoes - leather or vinyl. NOT trainers, canvas shoes or any other soft material. There should be NO CANVAS AT ALL ON THE SHOES.





Make-up - minimal and subtle. Heavy make-up, false eyelashes and false nails must be removed completely.

No jewellery other than a watch, one signet ring and one stud earring per ear.

Any other form of body piercing is unacceptable in school.

Students who have piercings must remove all body jewellery before coming to school.

Equipment - Every student should have a bag, pens, pencils and a ruler every day. They will need it every lesson.

Our office sells basic equipment - pens, pencils, rulers etc. at cost price before school, at break and lunchtime. Teachers will not be giving out equipment in lessons.







The House System @ Marden Which house are you in?

At Marden High we have a House System, with students being placed into one of four Houses named after Castles within the North East of England. The houses are, Alnwick, Bamburgh, Dunstanburgh, and Warkworth.

Each year group has four House Captains and Vice Captains, these students are responsible for leading by example in how they conduct themselves in and around school setting a great example to their peers. They have to demonstrate leadership skills by helping to organise House teams for sports competitions that take place throughout the year.

House Points - How to Earn Points

After every lesson you will be awarded 2 achievement points if you have met your teacher's high expectations, have worked consistently well, listened and applied yourself well throughout the lesson.

Additional points can be awarded if you display Responsibility, Resilience, Resourcefulness, Reasoning, Reflectiveness. You can also earn additional points for demonstrating outstanding effort, outstanding behaviour or displaying positive attitude to learning. Form Tutors will award points each week based on your attendance, punctuality, uniform and equipment.

Opportunities to earn additional points take place throughout the year, with departments running different competitions.

The House Challenge runs across the year, with an opportunity each week to earn House Points by completing various engaging and fun challenges. These can be by attending all week, completing work to an excellent standard, winning a Golden Ticket or taking on a subject based task like making Ecobricks for charity.

Assemblies are held throughout the year that share and update the points for the Houses and for students achieving the most points.

In the summer term, Sports Day will bring the Houses into competition enabling the students to win points for their House. The House Captains and Vice Captains will take responsibility and organise their teams. At the end of the year the House who have achieved highest points win the Marden High House Trophy.
