Dear All.

Following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth on Thursday afternoon, students and staff paid their respects in a minute's silence at 11.59 today. This coincided with the church bells ringing and gun salutes across the nation, as we came together as a country to reflect on the life of Elizabeth II. As a school we recognise that this is an important moment in our country's history and in the continuity of leadership the monarch gives, as the baton is passed to King Charles III. Queen Elizabeth has been our longest serving monarch, and one who, at times of political and social division, has been able to bring the country together and act as a stabilising influence. In this way, as our Head of State, she has been a great example of those most important aspects of leadership, service and duty, for many, many years. We are at the start of a period of national mourning and, as an educational institution, we will respond accordingly and I'll let our community know of any particular arrangements as we move through the next week or so.

We have now come to the end of our first week back in school with all our students settling into their new timetables and, for most, familiar routines. It is clear to me that our Key Stage 4 students have returned to school with some serious intent to do as well as they possibly can in their learning this term, and of course, to enjoy it as well. This term also sees Mrs Robson take over the reins as Deputy Headteacher at Marden. We were delighted with this appointment, and I know that the rich experience that Mrs Robson brings to this role will ensure her success and that of the school as we move forward.
