3.15pm finish on last day of term

As we finish for Easter on a Thursday we would like students to remain in school until 3.15pm. As we have our Leading our own Learning sessions for Y10 and Y11 (C27 and C26), these 2 hours on the Thursday afternoon are vital to the GCSE and BTEC choice curriculum. Our KS3 students will also benefit by ending the school day at 3.15pm.

We have had a great turn out at our D6 Saturday study sessions for our C26 (Y11) Students, this provision will open for taster sessions to C27 alongside C26 (Y10 students) on the 20th and 27th April 9.30am-12 pm to support with revision for the C27 mock exams.



Appreciation for support of same day reflection

We would like to appreciate parents for their support with our same day reflection protocol, this has rebooted for some individuals the cultural norms for students at XP and XP East. As such, our students are using their voices more in our community meetings to hold each other to account and verbalising apologies to put right any concerns around behaviour.

Instinct Training

During this term XP Outdoors has been slightly different, we had the privilege of collaborating with the exceptional Instincts Training Crew. It was an engaging and educational 4 week experience that took us on a journey, providing valuable insights into the principles of staying self online, the consequences of violence in 'One punch can kill' learning, misogyny, what that looks, sounds and feels like and self-defence and equipping us with the knowledge of how to protect ourselves in potentially threatening situations. We are incredibly proud of the engagement and participation from our students, their valuable input has also forged new ideas and content for Instinct Training to help support other young people.

Faster Reader in Y9 (C28)

We have trialled a new approach to reading with our C28 students this term, this approach has exposed our students to 2 high quality, high challenge anchor texts which have been taught concurrently and have been explored at pace. This has supported students to accelerate their reading progress. The average improvement across Y9 classes has been over a year's progress in reading ages within 6 weeks of the programme. We are so proud of the progress these students have made through these adaptations to the curriculum. This will be rolled out to further year groups as we move into the summer term expeditions.

Y9 Maths update

We are introducing some flexible grouping sessions into C28 (Y9) maths lessons to respond to the needs of the students in the year 9 cohort. We have understood that as year 9 has progressed, some students in the year have struggled to access the curriculum while others need increased challenge and this varies between topics and within an expedition. As such students will move between teachers and classes to ensure there is increased challenge and support for all students in the year group. In addition Y8 have built in some flexibility to their maths session which follows a skills based assessments task to ensure common misconceptions can be fully explored.

Clarity around English grades in KS3 Snapshots

In English at KS3 students have a combined predicted grade for English. Sometimes this grade will reflect a student's progress with their literature skills in English. This means their ability to comprehend and recall texts as well as analyse use of language, themes and character. Sometimes the grade will reflect a student's progress with their language skills in English. This means their ability to



write a length creatively and accurately adapting their time and style to meet the needs of the audience as well as understand novel fiction and non-fiction extracts. As a result this can mean there is a fluctuation in their grade and it reflects their skills in different areas. We are aware this can appear that students are a concern one term and performing well the next term or vice versa. We are working on resolving this in our academic performance work this term.

FXP tuck shop

We held our first FXP Tuck Shop on the 7th March, at this event we raised over £100 which will further support opportunities for our students. Thanks to those parents who have supported this.
