# Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education.

A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you. If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/ appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours. Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly.

## **Nut Free Packed Lunches**

Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. If someone has a nut allergy it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction, just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

So please can we ask that you have no nut products in the lunch boxes or brought into the school as treats. For example: peanut butter sandwiches, chocolate spreads, cereal bars, some granola bars, cakes that contain nuts, biscuits/cookies that contain nuts, some sauces, including satay, that contain nuts. This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely.

We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check and we know that you recognise the importance of it. We know if this was your child you would expect that we all help, especially as it is a life -threatening condition.

# Prayer and Liturgy First Sunday of Advent

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 21:25-28, 34-36 "There will be strange things happening to the sun, the moon, and the stars. On earth whole countries will be in despair, afraid of the roar of the sea and the raging tides. People will faint from fear as they wait for what is coming over the whole earth, for the powers in space will be driven from their courses. Then the Son of Man will appear, coming in a cloud with great power and glory. When these things begin to happen, stand up and raise your heads, because your salvation is near."

"Be on your guard. Don't let yourselves become occupied with too much feasting and drinking and with the worries of this life, or that Day may suddenly catch you like a trap. For it will come upon all people everywhere on earth. Be on the alert and pray always that you will have the strength to go safely through all those things that will happen and to stand before the Son of Man."



On Sunday a special time of the year begins, which is called Advent. It is a time of waiting and preparing for the coming of Jesus. How do you feel when you are waiting for something: for birthdays; for a new baby; etc? What kind of preparations do you make? Advent is also a time for remembering. What memories do you have of Christmas. During Advent we remember God's wonderful gifts to us. What gifts have been given to us by God? Life; parents; brothers; sisters; friends; etc.

We remember especially the greatest gift of love that God gives us: Jesus, his only Son. During Advent we prepare to celebrate Christmas, to remember Jesus' being born. And we also remember his promise to come again.

Churches display an Advent crown or Advent wreath during Advent. The Advent wreath is a circle of evergreen branches. There are four candles standing in the circle. In the centre, there is a fifth candle. A new candle is lit each Sunday during Advent until all four candles are burning. Each candle has a different meaning: 1. Hope 2. Peace 3. Joy 4. Love The final candle is lit on Christmas day to celebrate the birth of Jesus.



Loving God, may your love be with us always and bring peace and joy to all people around the world, as we wait in hope for the coming of your Son Jesus. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
