Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education.


Supervision After School Hours



Prayer and Liturgy

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we hear about Jesus' special love for those who are poor, hungry, sad or badly treated. Let's think a bit more about this.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

When Jesus had come down from the hill with the apostles, he stood on a level place with a large number of his disciples. A large crowd of people was there from all over Judea and from Jerusalem and from the coast cities of Tyre and Sidon;

6:17, 20-26

Jesus looked at his disciples and said,

"Happy are you poor; the Kingdom of God is yours!

"Happy are you who are hungry now; you will be filled!

"Happy are you who weep now; you will laugh!

"Happy are you when people hate you, reject you, insult you, and say that you are evil, all because of the Son of Man! Be glad when that happens and dance for joy, because a great reward is kept for you in heaven. For their ancestors did the very same things to the prophets.

"But how terrible for you who are rich now; you have had your easy life!

"How terrible for you who are full now; you will go hungry!

"How terrible for you who laugh now; you will mourn and weep!

"How terrible when all people speak well of you; their ancestor's said the very same things about the false prophets."

Jesus talks to the disciples, saying that some of the people will end up happy, while other people will not. Can you remember some of the people who he said would be happy?

Jesus says those who are poor will be happy, because the kingdom of God belongs to them. Jesus says those who are hungry will be happy, they will have enough to eat.

Jesus says those who cry will be happy, their tears will change to laughter.

Jesus says those who are hated and badly treated for believing in him will be happy, because they will be rewarded in heaven.

Can you remember who Jesus says wouldn't be happy and why not?

Jesus says those who are rich have everything they need now, and so do not need the gifts of heaven.

Jesus says those who have more than enough food now, will go hungry, and that those who laugh will be filled with sadness.

It can seem strange to us that it is those who are poor, or hungry, or even those who are sad, that Jesus says will be happiest. And it can seem very strange that Jesus says that those who are rich and happy with lots to eat will end up sad. It seems a bit upside down, doesn't it? So, why do you think Jesus said these things?

It's not Jesus' thinking that's upside down. It's ours. He doesn't want us to think that the only way we can be happy is to have lots of money and all the best toys and latest stuff.

Jesus loves <u>all</u> people, but he has a special love for people who are poor, hungry, sad or picked on. And he asks us to be the same.

We are called to do what we can to help all people in our world to be happy. What do you think we can do to help people who are poor, hungry, sad, or treated badly by others?


We can share what we have, we can comfort them. We can stick up for them and try to change the world to make it fairer for all people.

On Thursday 6th March 2025, we will be celebrating World Book Day. As this coincides with the launch of Science week, we will be asking children to dress as a scientific word. This can be in the form of any Science system. Children may want to dress up as a particular animal, season, weather type or scientist. There will be a competition for the best technical vocabulary so, for example, if a child dressed as a butterfly, their word could be lepidoptera, or a child dressing as a different character, their word could be phenotypic.

We will be holding a vocabulary parade throughout the day and children will be taking part in a variety of experiments that link to books and Science.
