Well done to Archie who was mascot for Liverpool last weekend.

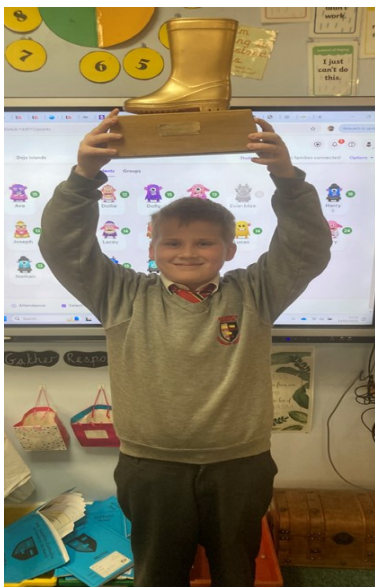


Golden Wellie and Golden Brush Award

Well done to the winners of our Golden Wellie and Golden Brush Awards.

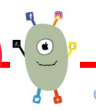
The golden brush award is for a pupil who has helped out cleaning up after lunch time play.

Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education.

A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you.

Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly.

If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours.

Absence Reporting - Seesaw

When reporting an absence please make sure you select both the 'Absence Reporting' and 'School Office' options as well as your class teacher.

This will ensure the right staff are receiving the information needed and you are not being contacted unnecessarily.

If you are sharing information regarding collection of a child or appointments they may have, please make sure you select the 'School Office' option as well as your class teacher. Thank you!

Supervision After School Hours

We would like to remind you of our after-school supervision policy to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students. Please be aware that there is no supervision available for children after the end of the school day. It is important that all children are picked up promptly at the end of their school day.

For safety reasons, any child who is not collected by 3:45 PM will be placed in our Night Owls provision. This ensures that all children are supervised in a safe environment until they can be picked up. Please note that there is a £10 charge for this service, which will be billed to parents.

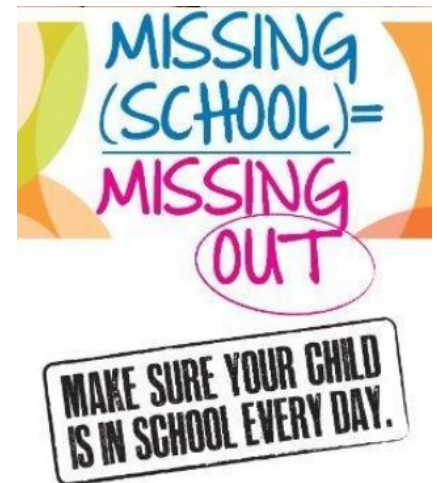
We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all children are picked up on time and that our school remains a safe and secure place for everyone.

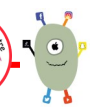
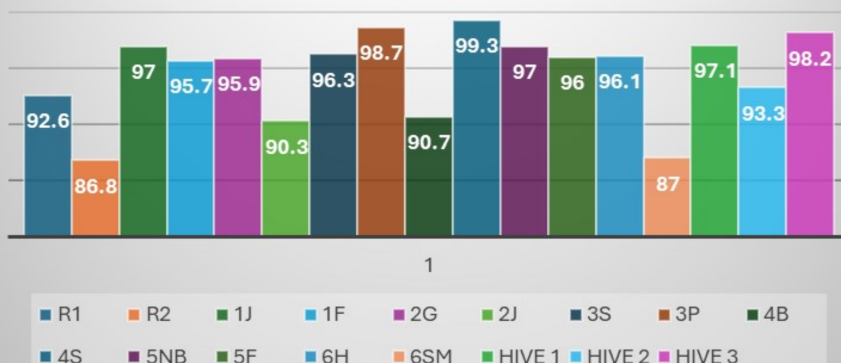


Good school attendance supports children to feel confident and happy about school and learning

Prayer and Liturgy

Second Sunday of Lent

This week, we hear about Jesus' special love for those who are poor, hungry, sad or badly treated. Let's think a bit more about this.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 6:17, 20-26

When Jesus had come down from the hill with the apostles, he stood on a level place with a large number of his disciples. A large crowd of people was there from all over Judea and from Jerusalem and from the coast cities of Tyre and Sidon:

Jesus looked at his disciples and said,

“Happy are you poor; the Kingdom of God is yours!

“Happy are you who are hungry now; you will be filled!

“Happy are you who weep now; you will laugh!

“Happy are you when people hate you, reject you, insult you, and say that you are evil, all because of the Son of Man! Be glad when that happens and dance for joy, because a great reward is kept for you in heaven. For their ancestors did the very same things to the prophets.

“But how terrible for you who are rich now; you have had your easy life!

“How terrible for you who are full now; you will go hungry!

“How terrible for you who laugh now; you will mourn and weep!

“How terrible when all people speak well of you; their ancestors said the very same things about the false prophets.”

Jesus talks to the disciples, saying that some of the people will end up happy, while other people will not. Can you remember some of the people who he said would be happy?

Jesus says those who are poor will be happy, because the kingdom of God belongs to them.

Jesus says those who are hungry will be happy, they will have enough to eat.

Jesus says those who cry will be happy, their tears will change to laughter.

Jesus says those who are hated and badly treated for believing in him will be happy, because they will be rewarded in heaven.

Can you remember who Jesus says wouldn't be happy and why not?

Jesus says those who are rich have everything they need now, and so do not need the gifts of heaven.

Jesus says those who have more than enough food now, will go hungry, and that those who laugh will be filled with sadness.

It can seem strange to us that it is those who are poor, or hungry, or even those who are sad, that Jesus says will be happiest. And it can seem very strange that Jesus says that those who are rich and happy with lots to eat will end up sad. It seems a bit upside down, doesn't it?

So, why do you think Jesus said these things?

It's not Jesus' thinking that's upside down. It's ours. He doesn't want us to think that the only way we can be happy is to have lots of money and all the best toys and latest stuff.

Jesus loves all people, but he has a special love for people who are poor, hungry, sad or picked on. And he asks us to be the same.

We are called to do what we can to help all people in our world to be happy. What do you think we can do to help people who are poor, hungry, sad, or treated badly by others?

We can share what we have, we can comfort them. We can stick up for them and try to change the world to make it fairer for all people.

What will you do this week if you see someone who is sad, hungry or hurt?

God of love,
open our hearts to others,
that we may bring comfort
to those who are sad,
and share what we have
with those who are in need.
