Mrs J Maguire - Headteacher

Dear Parents,

As we come to the end of the Spring Term, I thought we would give you all the relevant information about the leadership at the school and the changes that lie ahead.

Firstly, Mr Barnes. As you know, since the beginning of 2024, he has been seconded full-time as the primary school improvement lead at the Pope Francis Catholic Multi-Academy Trust, based in Sefton. This secondment will come to an end at the end of August. Mr Barnes has decided to either carry on working in the Trust, or take on other work within education. As such, he will leave his employment at All Saints after 19 years at the school.

Therefore, the governors at All Saints have advertised for a new headteacher at the school, to start on September 1st 2025. This recruitment process will be rigorous and will last until the end of April. Governors are determined to recruit the very best candidate to serve All Saints.

This brings us on to Mrs Maguire. As you know Mrs Maguire has acted up as headteacher over the last two years and has done a wonderful job. But she has decided not to apply for the position in September and instead will move into a well-deserved retirement. We wish her the very best for the new life ahead.

Parents and community will be encouraged by two things that will assist the new headteacher when he/she takes up post. Firstly, the fact that we have many talented and experienced leaders at the school ready to support the successful candidate. And secondly, the report from the Ofsted inspection in March, which is extremely positive about the school's work. The new headteacher can build on the many strengths whilst addressing some of the improvement areas highlighted by the report. We expect this report to be available to parents very soon.

We intend to mark the service of both Mr Barnes and Mrs Maguire during the summer term. Between them, they have given 34 years of service to our school to which we are all very grateful. Their commitment to our children has been integral to the school's development as a popular, thriving primary school. They hand over a school in a very good position to develop further and one that can continue to serve our families and children in an ever-more enriching way.


The Greatest Week (Easter)








