

Stay Sun Safe at School!

With the warmer weather upon us, we want to ensure that all our children stay safe while enjoying their time outdoors.

We kindly remind parents to send their children to school with a **suitable sun hat** each day. Hats provide essential protection from the sun, and we encourage children to wear them whenever needed. If a child forgets or misplaces theirs, we do our best to provide spare hats so that everyone can participate safely in outdoor activities.

Similarly, **sunscreen** is an important part of sun safety. We ask parents to provide an appropriately protective sunscreen for their child to use throughout the school day. This can either be a whole day sunscreen or a bottle with the child's name in sent into school to be reapplied. If a child forgets, loses, or runs out of their own, we make additional sunscreen available for outdoor activities. This is the sunscreen we currently use:


Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that your child is on time for school each day, so that they can benefit from a full day's education.

A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you.

Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly.

If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/ appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours.

As a parent you can support your child to enjoy school life to the full by ensuring they attend school EVERY day and also arrive on time.

Supervision After School Hours

We would like to remind you of our after-school supervision policy to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students. Please be aware that there is no supervision available for children after the end of the school day. It is important that all children are picked up promptly at the end of their school day.

For safety reasons, any child who is not collected by 3:45 PM will be placed in our Night Owls provision. This ensures that all children are supervised in a safe environment until they can be picked up. Please note that there is a £10 charge for this service, which will be billed to parents.


We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all children are picked up on time and that our school remains a safe and secure place for everyone.

Prayer and Liturgy

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Jesus talks about how important it is to listen to him. And how he knows and cares about every one of us, no matter who we are. Let's think some more about this today.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 10:27-30

My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never die. No one can snatch them away from me. What my Father has given me is greater than everything, and no one can snatch them away from the Father's care. The Father and I are one.

Today Jesus talks about sheep. Jesus didn't spend his time looking after sheep out in the fields, so who do you think Jesus' sheep are? Who is he talking about?

Jesus is a shepherd of people. He shows us the way to live our lives. He looks after us and cares for us, just as a shepherd looks after their sheep.

What does Jesus say about his sheep in the gospel reading today?

Jesus says that his sheep listen to his voice.

How do we listen to Jesus in our lives? (*Through hearing his word in the readings, through prayer etc*) Jesus also says that he knows his sheep and that they will never be lost. What do you think this means? Jesus cares for every one of us. No matter who we are or from where we come.

Ruben lives in Bolivia with his parents and his little brother. They grow lots of yummy food to eat in their greenhouse. Ruben's favourite vegetable is lettuce because it is tasty and he likes eating it in salad.

Worqi lives in Kenya with her mum, her brother and her two younger sisters. Worqi enjoys playing shops, using old bottle tops as counters. Her mum has a shop where she sells the vegetables that her community grows in their garden. Worqi's favourite food is the vegetables that her mum grows. She says, "I like rice with onions and tomatoes and potatoes."

Lombeh lives in Sierra Leone. When she was a baby Lombeh was very ill because she did not have enough to eat. But now she is a bold and lively girl who loves to play with her dolls. Her mum hopes that Lombeh will be a doctor when she grows up.

These three children live in different places around the world. Can you tell us some things that are different about each of the children? And can you tell us something that is the same? Are these children the same as or different to you? How?

We are all different from each other, but we are also very alike. We all need enough food and water to live. We all like to have fun with our friends. We are all part of the same global family and so we are all very special and important. Jesus loves and cares for us all.

How does it make you feel to know that Jesus loves and cares for all of us, no matter who or where we are? What do you think this means for how we should treat each other?

Jesus asks us to treat other people as we would wish to be treated. This week, let's try to listen to what Jesus is saying to us, and share the love that he has for us all with others.

Lord Jesus, help us to listen to and follow you and to care for each other, so that all members of our global family may live together in peace. Amen.
