Dear all,

I am writing to thank you for supporting the schools programme under the UK's 100-year partnership with Ukraine.

This historic partnership, which I was proud to sign in Kyiv earlier this year together with President Zelenskyy, is a statement of our unshakeable commitment to Ukraine – our pledge to stand with them in defending their country today and building a brighter future for tomorrow.

We are all affected by the instability that aggressors like Russia create. That is why standing with Ukraine in countering Russia's invasion is deeply in our national interest – both today and in the future. And it is why we are investing in the UK's security with the largest increase in defence spending since the Cold War.

But of course, we are not standing with Ukraine for our national interest alone – we are also standing with them because it is right. We have all been outraged by what the Ukrainian people have endured, moved by their bravery, and determined to help in any way we can.

The schools programme is part of this, as a clear illustration of the deep bonds between our two countries. Thousands of school children across the UK and Ukraine have applied to take part, and 100 schools are now being paired.

I saw for myself how powerful this can be when I visited Number 219 School in Kyiv and joined a lesson they held with All Saints Catholic Primary School in Anfield. Those pupils in Kyiv have known terrible hardship so it was wonderful to see their joy when the smiling faces from Liverpool appeared on the screen. By building links in this way, I believe we can help children on both sides expand their horizons, build their confidence, and form friendships that could last a lifetime.

So to you, and to all the British parents and children taking part, I want to say: thank you.

The workshop enabled the children to renew their sowing skills, chalk stencils on the walls and also conduct scientific tests on the ground to check porosity values.

Porosity values provide information about how tightly packed the soil is beneath the ground and how suitable the soil is for supporting life.

Paediatric First Aid Course


A Paediatric First Aid Course for parents is booked for Friday 4th July 9am-12.30pm in the School hall. More information to follow.

Attendance and Punctuality

A reminder that holidays during school time are not authorised whatever the circumstances and a local authority fine will be issued. If you do take your child on holiday, please inform us before you go as it could become a safeguarding issue if we cannot contact you.

Please report any absences before 9.00am via Seesaw or telephone call. If you have any difficulties getting your child to school and especially around lateness please contact Mrs Kelly.

If you are taking your child out of school during the school day, you must show a letter/email/ appointment card. Please do your best to make appointments outside of school hours.



Supervision After School Hours

We would like to remind you of our after-school supervision policy to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students. Please be aware that there is no supervision available for children after the end of the school day. It is important that all children are picked up promptly at the end of their school day.

For safety reasons, any child who is not collected by 3:45 PM will be placed in our Night Owls provision. This ensures that all children are supervised in a safe environment until they can be picked up. Please note that there is a £10 charge for this service, which will be billed to parents.


We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that all children are picked up on time and that our school remains a safe and secure place for everyone.

Prayer and Liturgy

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Jesus has a very important message for his disciples, and for all who believe in him. Jesus asks us to love one another as he loves us. Let's think about how we can do that today.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 13:31-35

After Judas had left, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man's glory is revealed; now God's glory is revealed through him. And if God's glory is revealed through him, then God will reveal the glory of the Son of Man in himself, and he will do so at once. My children, I shall not be with you very much longer. You will look for me; but I tell you now what I told the Jewish authorities, "You cannot go where I am going." And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples."

Jesus tells his disciples that he will not be with them much longer and he tells them how he'd like them to behave. Can you remember what he told them to do?

Jesus told the disciples to love one another, just as he had loved them.

What do you think this means? How did Jesus show his love for people?

Jesus spent time with people, especially those who were sick, lonely, frightened or poor. He listened to them and ate with them. He healed them and he helped them to change their lives for the better.

Do you think this message to love other people was just for the disciples? What do you think Jesus wants us to do?

Jasmin lives in Peru. There is lots of violence where she lives, but Jasmin belongs to a children's group that tries to improve their area. Together they created a children's park. Jasmin and her friends helped to clear the rubbish and now they have a safe place to play.

The children at St Chad's primary school in Croydon made friendship bracelets to sell to raise money and awareness for CAFOD and to support people who are living in poverty as they try to build a better world. As Faith explained: "We want to try and help our global neighbours. We are all part of God's family, and all families take care of each other."

How do you think Jasmin and the children at St Chad's school are showing their love for others? Their stories show us that we can all make a difference and find our own way to love one another.

Jesus asks us all to love one another as he loves us. What will you do to show your love for others this week?

Generous God, fill our hearts with your love and help us to share this love with all our brothers and sisters throughout the world. Amen.
